Fifty-sixth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, January 29, 1999

assistance billings to six ambulance services on a pilot project basis at a cost of \$30,000 from funds, other than emergency medical services funding, appropriated to the department in House Bill No. 1004."

SECTION 1. Uninsured motorist - Insurance deductible. If a person causes damage to another or another's property with a motor vehicle while in violation of section 39-08-20, the court shall order that person to pay to the other person the amount of the deductible on that person's insurance."

SB 2265: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision g of subsection 3 of section 49-23-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to time periods under the one-call excavation notice system.

SB 2318: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 57-40.6-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to ballot measures on the question of excise taxes on telephone access lines.
