Fifty-sixth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, March 2, 1999

The Senate convened at 1:00 p.m., with President Myrdal presiding.

The prayer was offered by Pastor Darrel Saathoff, Christ Lutheran, Minot.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senator C. Nelson.

A quorum was declared by the President.

MOTION

SEN. ST. AUBYN MOVED that after action taken on the Sixth order, SCR 4052 and SCR 4053 be placed on the Eleventh order, as amended, for immediate second reading and final passage, and HB 1426 be placed on the Fourteenth order, as amended, for immediate second reading and final passage, which motion prevailed.

CONSIDERATION OF AMENDMENTS

Was read the first time and referred to the **Agriculture Committee**.

HCR 3055: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the extent of and remedies for damage caused to landowners from depredation by big game animals, waterfowl, and turkeys and damage caused to property by hunters.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Natural Resources Committee**.

HCR 3062: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study alternative dispositions, including boot camps, for youth in the juvenile justice system.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

HCR 3063: A concurrent resolution urging Congress to encourage the formation of new legislative or administrative initiatives that would provide farmers with crop insurance options that offer true revenue or income protection and which add hay or other grazable grasses to the scope of covered commodities, and to encourage the formation of new legislative or administrative initiatives that address the high cost of crop insurance coverage and specifically examine the percentage of farmers' premiums used to support the administration of crop insurance programs.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Agriculture Committee**.

HCR 3067: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to review and monitor the implementation of legislation enacted by the Fifty-sixth Legislative Assembly which provides for the delivery of clerk of district court services through state funding and alternative methods.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

HCR 3068: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of an equitable sharing, between the state and counties, of the costs of providing facilities for the delivery of state-funded judicial and clerk of court services.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

HCR 3070: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study health care in this state relative to access, quality, and cost to determine essential health care services, critical providers, access sites, and geographic, demographic, and economic issues relating to health care including health care insurance.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Human Services Committee**.

HCR 3073: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of adjustments to income tax deductions for military and other federal retirees.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

HCR 3074: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the amount and value of property owned by nonprofit organizations in this state and the impact of that ownership on local communities and the economy of this state.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Political Subdivisions Committee**.

HCR 3079: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the relationship of rural subdivisions and townships.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Political Subdivisions Committee**.

HCR 3080: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the provision of air service in this state.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator St. Aubyn's motion.
