- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the parks and
- 2 recreation department and the International Peace Garden; to provide contingent
- 3 appropriations for the international music camp and boat ramp improvements; to provide for a
- 4 transfer; to amend and reenact section 54-44.4-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 5 to state procurement; to provide for a report; and to declare an emergency.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION. The amounts identified in this 8 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the parks and recreation 9 department in section 3 of this Act as follows:

28	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
29	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and		
30	other income, to the parks and recreation department for the purpose of def	raying the

GAME AND FISH OPERATING FUND - TRANSFER. The sum of 23 \$381,750, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the estimated income line 24 item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is from the game and fish operating fund, or 25 federal or other funds available to the game and fish department, and must be transferred to 26 the parks and recreation department for maintenance, operating, and extraordinary repairs 27 expenses relating to boat ramps at various state parks for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, 28 and ending June 30, 2009. Of the \$381,750, \$109,750 is for boat ramp improvements at Fort 29 Stevenson state park and may only be spent if the corps of engineers does not begin 30 construction of the marina at Fort Stevenson by March 31, 2008.

## 1 SECTION 5. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - INTERNATIONAL MUSIC CAMP. 2 The sum of \$200,000 included in the international music camp contingency line item in 3 section 3 of this Act is from the general fund, and the sum of \$200,000 included in the 4 international music camp contingency line item in section 3 of this Act is from other funds 5 available to the International Peace Garden. The International Peace Garden may only spend 6 the general fund appropriation to the extent other funds become available on a dollar-for-dollar 7 matching basis. 8 SECTION 6. CAPITAL ASSETS - INSURANCE PROCEEDS - APPROPRIATION. 9 The amount in the capital assets line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act includes 10 \$125,000 from the general fund and \$108,000 from insurance proceeds to be used to replace a 11 maintenance building and other capital assets owned by the parks and recreation department 12 that were destroyed by fire. Any additional income from insurance proceeds, in excess of the 13 \$108,000, is appropriated, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending 14 June 30, 2009, to the parks and recreation department to assist with the replacement of the 15 maintenance building and other capital assets. 16 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-44.4-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 17 amended and reenacted as follows: 18 54-44.4-02. Office of management and budget purchasing services. The office of 19 management and budget shall purchase or lease or otherwise arrange for the procurement, for 20 all state agencies and institutions in the executive branch of state government, all materials, 21 furniture, fixtures, printing, insurance, services, and other commodities. The International 22 Peace Garden may participate in the procurement authorized by this section. The following 23 commodities and services, however, are not subject to the procurement requirements of this 24 chapter: 25 1. Land, buildings, space, or the rental thereof. 26 2. Telephone and telegraph service and electrical light and power services. 27 3. Public books, maps, periodicals, and technical pamphlets. 28 4. Department of transportation materials, equipment, and supplies in accordance 29 with section 24-02-16. 30 5. Procurements through a contract or other instrument executed by the industrial 31 commission under chapter 54-17.5.

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- 6. Services for the maintenance or servicing of equipment by the manufacturer or authorized servicing agent of that equipment when the maintenance or servicing can best be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service agent, or when such a contract would otherwise be advantageous to the state.
- 7. Emergency purchases the office of management and budget cannot make within the required time and which involve public health or public safety, or when immediate expenditures are necessary for repairs of state property to protect it against further loss or damage, or to prevent or minimize serious disruption in state services. Emergency purchases must be made with the level of competition practicable under the circumstances, and a written determination of the basis for the emergency and for the selection of the particular contractor must be included in the contract file.
- 8. Commodities and services costing less than a specified amount as determined by written directive by the director of the office of management and budget.
- Specified commodities and services as determined by written directive by the director of the office of management and budget.
- Employee benefit services, trust-related services, and investment management services obtained by an agency with a fiduciary responsibility regarding those services.
- All purchases made by the office of management and budget or a state agency or institution to which authority to purchase has been delegated by the office of management and budget must be made in accordance with this chapter, rules adopted under this chapter, and written policies of the office of management and budget.
- SECTION 8. ONE-TIME FUNDING EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET REPORT TO SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The total general fund appropriation line item in section 3 of this Act includes \$5,388,000 for the one-time funding items identified in this section. This amount is not a part of the agency's base budget to be used in preparing the 2009-11 executive budget. The parks and recreation department shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-first legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
