

**SECOND ENGROSSMENT

REENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2070

(At the request of the Department of Human Services)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide for application by the department of human services for federal
2 funds for the implementation of an aging and disability resource center; to provide an
3 appropriation; and to declare an emergency.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. Application for aging and disability resource center funding.** No later
6 than December 31, 2007, the department of human services shall seek federal funds for the
7 planning and implementation of an aging and disability resource center for the state. The
8 resource center will be a single point of information program at the community level which will
9 help people make informed decisions about the full range of long-term care service and support
10 options, including both institutional and home and community-based care, and which will
11 provide unbiased information and assistance to individuals needing either public or private
12 resources, to professionals seeking assistance on behalf of their clients, and to individuals
13 planning for their future long-term care needs. Upon receipt of federal funds, the department of
14 human services may establish the aging and disability resource center or it may request bids
15 and award a contract for the provision of this service. The duties of the aging and disability
16 resource center must include all duties required to receive federal funds, including providing
17 information about the full range of long-term care service and support options available in the
18 state to assure that consumers may make informed decisions about their care. The resource
19 center must be free from a conflict of interest which would inappropriately influence or bias the
20 actions of a contractor, staff member, board member, or volunteer of the resource center to
21 limit the information given to a consumer to steer the consumer to services that may also be
22 provided by the resource center.

23 **SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the
24 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$40,000, or so much

1 of the sum as may be necessary, and from special funds derived from federal funds, the sum of
2 \$800,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary to the department of human services
3 for the purpose of establishing or contracting for the provision of an aging and disability
4 resource center, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30,
5 2009. The department may use the funds appropriated from the general fund only if the
6 department receives federal funds for an aging and disability resource center as described in
7 section 1 of this Act. Any general fund amounts not used for the period beginning with the
8 effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2009, may not be spent.

9 **SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
