## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1013

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

(At the request of the Governor)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of  
2 public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services - school for the blind,  
3 and the state library; to provide an appropriation; to provide for the distribution of funding for  
4 gifted and talented programs and other grants; to provide a contingent appropriation; to provide  
5 for the development and implementation of a future services plan for the school for the deaf; to  
6 amend and reenact section 15.1-02-02 and subsection 6 of section 15.1-29-14 of the North  
7 Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the superintendent of public instruction and  
8 special education cost reimbursements; and to declare an emergency.

9 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

10 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the  
11 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state  
12 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and  
13 other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota  
14 vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the  
15 expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30,  
16 2011, as follows:

 21 **SIXTY-SECOND LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The following amounts reflect the one-time  
 22 funding items approved by the sixtieth legislative assembly for the 2007-09 biennium and the  
 23 2009-11 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

8 The 2009-11 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the  
9 2011-13 biennium. The department of public instruction, school for the deaf, and school for the  
10 blind - vision services shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-second  
11 legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1,  
12 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

13 **SECTION 3. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE - TRANSFERS - SCHOOL FOR THE**  
14 **DEAF.** The school for the deaf is authorized to transfer from the deferred maintenance line to  
15 the capital assets line, contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act, amounts necessary to  
16 address extraordinary repair needs. Any amounts transferred must be reported to the director  
17 of the office of management and budget.

18 **SECTION 4. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE - TRANSFERS - SCHOOL FOR THE**  
19 **BLIND - VISION SERVICES.** The school for the blind - vision services is authorized to transfer  
20 from the deferred maintenance line to the capital assets line, contained in subdivision 4 of  
21 section 1 of this Act, amounts necessary to address extraordinary repair needs. Any amounts  
22 transferred must be reported to the director of the office of management and budget.

23 **SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated from special funds derived  
24 from federal funds and other income the sum of \$20,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be  
25 necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for grants for the period beginning with  
26 the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2009.

27 **SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT.** The sum of  
28 \$86,300,000, included in the grants - state school aid line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of  
29 this Act, is from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state  
30 tuition fund that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the

1 department of public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and  
2 ending June 30, 2011.

3 **SECTION 7. STATE SCHOOL AID AND SPECIAL EDUCATION CONTRACTS**

4 **EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY.** The superintendent of public instruction may expend funds  
5 included in the grants - state school aid and grants - special education contracts line items in  
6 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational services that were  
7 due in the 2007-09 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly supported by the  
8 education provider until after June 30, 2009.

9 **SECTION 8. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION.**

10 The sum of \$800,000, included in the grants - state school aid line item in subdivision 1 of  
11 section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts or special education units  
12 for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an application that is approved in  
13 accordance with guidelines adopted by the superintendent of public instruction. The  
14 superintendent of public instruction shall encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented  
15 programs among school districts and special education units. State school aid payments for  
16 special education must be reduced by the amount of matching funds required to be paid by  
17 school districts or special education units for students participating in the medicaid program.  
18 Special education funds equal to the amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the  
19 school district or special education unit must be paid by the superintendent of public instruction  
20 to the department of human services on behalf of the school district or unit.

21 **SECTION 9. GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT GRADUATE**

22 **ASSESSMENT - FUNDING.** The department of public instruction shall make available, from  
23 funds appropriated in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, for the state assessment program,  
24 amounts necessary, as requested by adult education providers to defray the costs of  
25 assessment testing of general educational development diploma graduates for the biennium  
26 beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

27 **SECTION 10. TEACHER OF THE YEAR PROGRAM - FUNDING.** The department of  
28 public instruction shall administer a teacher of the year program for the biennium beginning  
29 July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. The department of public instruction shall assign  
30 responsibility to its department staff to coordinate the annual event, including preparation of  
31 application materials, distribution of materials to the selection committee, publicity, and

1 planning of the event at which the recipient of the award is announced. The selection  
2 committee appointed by the department of public instruction may not include more than one  
3 representative from any education-related organization or association.

4 **SECTION 11. INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION.** Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-15,  
5 the department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating  
6 account.

7 **SECTION 12. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES.** The line item entitled grants in  
8 subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,300,000 for aid to public libraries, of which no  
9 more than one-half is to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.

10 **SECTION 13. FEES DEPOSITED IN VISION SERVICES - SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND**  
11 **OPERATING FUND.** Any moneys included in the estimated income line item in subdivision 4  
12 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be deposited in the  
13 North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state treasury and may  
14 be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly.

15 **SECTION 14. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - SUPPLEMENTAL**  
16 **TRANSPORTATION AID PAYMENTS.**

17 1. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury,  
18 not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000,000, or so much of the sum as may  
19 be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of  
20 providing supplemental transportation aid payments, for the biennium beginning  
21 July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

22 2. If the office of management and budget determines by July 31, 2010, that the  
23 June 30, 2011, ending balance of the state general fund will be more than  
24 \$30,000,000 in excess of the amount predicted by the office of management and  
25 budget at the conclusion of the 2009 legislative session, the superintendent of  
26 public instruction shall provide \$5,000,000 as supplemental transportation aid  
27 payments to school districts.

28 3. If the general fund balance requirements of subsection 2 are not met and if the  
29 office of management and budget determines by April 30, 2011, that the June 30,  
30 2011, ending balance of the state general fund will be more than \$30,000,000 in  
31 excess of the amount predicted by the office of management and budget at the

1 conclusion of the 2009 legislative session, the superintendent of public instruction  
2 shall provide \$5,000,000 as supplemental transportation aid payments to school  
3 districts.

4 4. The superintendent of public instruction shall pro rate the supplemental  
5 transportation payments according to the percentage of the total transportation  
6 formula amount that each school district is entitled to receive under 2009 House  
7 Bill No. 1400 as approved by the sixty-first legislative assembly.

8 **SECTION 15. FUTURE SERVICES PLAN AND IMPLEMENTATION - SCHOOL FOR**  
9 **THE DEAF.** The department of public instruction and school for the deaf shall develop a plan  
10 for future services to be offered by the school for the deaf and begin implementing the plan for  
11 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. As part of the plan, the  
12 department of public instruction and school for the deaf shall:

- 13 1. Review the needs of all deaf and hearing-impaired persons throughout the state  
14 and develop a plan to provide comprehensive outreach services to all North  
15 Dakota citizens who are deaf or hearing-impaired.
- 16 2. Explore the development of partnerships with other states relating to the provision  
17 of residential and educational services to individuals who are deaf or  
18 hearing-impaired.
- 19 3. Review current research and national trends in the provision of services to  
20 students who are deaf or hearing-impaired.
- 21 4. Meet regularly with a transition team appointed by the superintendent of public  
22 instruction consisting of representation from the legislative assembly, parents of  
23 school for the deaf students, school for the deaf employees, members of the Devils  
24 Lake community, school for the deaf alumni, and others.
- 25 5. Explore the feasibility of implementing revenue-generating activities at the school  
26 for the deaf.
- 27 6. Develop a long-range site and facility plan for the school for the deaf campus.

28 **SECTION 16. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
29 amended and reenacted as follows:

30 **15.1-02-02. Salary.** The annual salary of the superintendent of public instruction is  
31 ~~eighty-seven~~ ninety-five thousand one hundred ~~three~~ sixteen dollars through June 30, ~~2008~~

1 2010, and ~~ninety~~ ninety-nine thousand ~~five~~ eight hundred ~~eighty-seven~~ seventy-two dollars  
2 thereafter.

3 **SECTION 17. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 6 of section 15.1-29-14 of the North Dakota  
4 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

5 6. a. An amount equal to the state average per student elementary or high school  
6 cost, depending on the student's grade of enrollment, is payable to the  
7 admitting district or facility as part of the cost of educating the student for the  
8 school year. The payment may not exceed the actual per student cost  
9 incurred by the admitting district or facility.

10 b. The remainder of the actual cost of educating the student not covered by  
11 other payments or credits must be paid by the state, within the limits of  
12 legislative appropriations, from funds appropriated for the payment of special  
13 education contract charges in the case of a student with disabilities or from  
14 state aid payments to schools in all other cases. For purposes of this  
15 subdivision, "actual costs" includes the cost of a summer program if the  
16 program is a condition of placement at a residential facility that has been  
17 determined by a placing agency or entity to be an appropriate placement for a  
18 student.

19 **SECTION 18. EMERGENCY.** Section 5 of this Act is declared to be an emergency  
20 measure.
