HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3028

1	A concurrent resolution urging the Sixty-third Legislative Assembly to recognize the month of
2	November 2013 as "Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease Awareness Month" throughout the
3	state in recognition of this deadly disease and its effects on the citizens of North Dakota and
4	encourage all residents of North Dakota to learn more about the prevention and treatment of
5	chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.
6	WHEREAS, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, also known as chronic bronchitis and
7	emphysema, is the third-leading cause of death in the United States and is the second-leading
8	cause of disability; and
9	WHEREAS, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease is a chronic and progressive disease
10	that affects over 24 million individuals in the United States, one-half of whom have not been
11	properly diagnosed and 70 percent of whom are under age 65; and
12	WHEREAS, the major risk factor for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease is smoking.
13	Other risks include environmental and workplace exposure to air pollution, a history of
14	childhood respiratory infection, and genetics; and
15	WHEREAS, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease currently accounts for 1.5 million
16	emergency room visits, 726,000 hospitalizations, and 8 million physician office and hospital
17	outpatient visits, all of which are a detriment to the United States economy; and
18	WHEREAS, the United States annual cost of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease in
19	2010 was estimated to be \$49.39 billion; and
20	WHEREAS, one-half of the persons with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease
21	(51 percent) report that their condition limits their ability to work, while 34 percent say that
22	chronic obstructive pulmonary disease keeps them from working and 17 percent say their
23	condition limits them in the kind or amount of work they can do; and
24	WHEREAS, early chronic obstructive pulmonary disease screening and a diagnosis test for

chronic obstructive pulmonary disease known as spirometry is available for office use, yet most

obstructive pulmonary disease.

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1 people are not diagnosed until they have reached an advanced stage of chronic obstructive 2 pulmonary disease; and 3 WHEREAS, there is no cure for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, and its lung 4 damage is irreversible. Treatments, however, can improve a patient's quality of life and prevent 5 symptoms, reduce the frequency and severity of exacerbation, improve health status, and 6 improve the ability to exercise; and 7 WHEREAS, until there is a cure, increased public awareness, early detection, and proper 8 health management can slow the progression of the disease and lead to reduced costs and 9 improved quality of life for our residents; 10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF 11 NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: 12 That the Sixty-third Legislative Assembly recognizes the month of November 2013 as 13 "Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease Awareness Month" throughout the state in recognition 14 of this deadly disease and its effects on the citizens of North Dakota and encourages all
