- 2 A. **Bill and fiscal impact summary:** *Provide a brief summary of the measure, including description of the provisions having fiscal impact (limited to 300 characters).*

Engrossed SB 2036 provides a residential property tax credit for an individual's primary residence. It also updates the oil and gas tax revenue that goes into the property tax relief sustainability fund, provides for a transfer and an appropriation.

Section 1 creates a state reimbursed property tax credit for a resident's primary residence equal to 50% of the true and full value up to \$25,000 per residence. Section 2 provides for an increase in oil and gas tax revenues deposited in the property tax relief sustainability fund to \$403,407,000 for the 2013-15 biennium. This will move \$61,617,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund to the property tax sustainability fund. Both of these are "other funds" in 1A above.

Section 5 transfers \$341,790,000 to the state general fund from the property tax sustainability fund on July 1, 2013.

Section 1 of engrossed SB 2036 creates a state reimbursed property tax credit for residents' primary residences. This is expected to increase state general fund expenditures by an estimated \$126 million in the 2013-15 biennium.
