1	A BILL for an	Act to create	and enact chapter	43-36.1 of the	North Dakota	Century Code,
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- 2 relating to soil classifiers; to amend and reenact subsection 28 of section 38-14.1-02 and
- 3 subdivision t of subsection 1 of section 38-14.1-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 4 to soil classifiers; to repeal chapter 43-36 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to soil
- 5 classifiers; and to provide for a report to the legislative management.

#### 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 28 of section 38-14.1-02 of the North Dakota
   Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 28. "Soil classifier" means a professional soil classifier as defined in subsection 4 of section 43-36-01an individual registered with the board of soil classifiers in
- 11 <u>accordance with chapter 43-36.1</u>.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision t of subsection 1 of section 38-14.1-14 of the North
  Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - t. A soil survey of all the suitable plant growth material within the permit area. Such survey must also locate and identify prime soils in the permit area. The survey must be made by a professional soil classifier as described in subsection 4 of section 43-36-01an individual registered with the board of soil classifiers in accordance with chapter 43-36.1.
- SECTION 3. Chapter 43-36.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## 21 **43-36.1-01. Definition.**

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- 1. In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, "soil classification" means the
   determination of a soil's suitability for a particular purpose through:
  - <u>a.</u> The examination of landscape and landform characteristics;

1		b. The sampling or analysis, or both, of soil properties and characteristics;
2		c. The identification and description of soil profile characteristics, including soil
3		horizons;
4		d. The identification of plant growth material; and
5		e. The preparation of soil survey maps and reports.
6	<u>2.</u>	The term "soil classification" does not include:
7		a. The sampling and testing of soil for fertility status;
8		b. The sampling and testing of soil for the presence of construction materials;
9		c. The practice of architecture, as defined in chapter 43-03;
10		d. The practice of engineering, as defined in chapter 43-19.1;
11		e. The practice of landscape architecture, as defined in chapter 43-03; or
12		f. Water well contracting, water well pump and pitless unit installing, monitoring well
13		contracting, and geothermal system drilling, if performed by persons certified in
14		accordance with chapter 43-35.
15	<u>43-3</u>	6.1-02. Board of soil classifiers.
16	<u>1.</u>	The board of soil classifiers consists of five individuals, three of whom must be soil
17		classifiers registered under this chapter.
18	<u>2.</u>	The governor shall appoint each member of the board.
19	<u>43-3</u>	6.1-03. Terms of office - Vacancy.
20	<u>1.</u>	The term of office for each member is five years and begins on July first.
21	<u>2.</u>	The terms must be staggered so that no more than one term expires each year.
22	<u>3.</u>	A member may not serve more than three consecutive terms.
23	<u>4.</u>	If an individual is appointed to fill a vacancy, that service is not counted as a term, for
24		purposes of this section, unless the duration of that service exceeds two years.
25	<u>5.</u>	If at any time during a member's term the member ceases to possess any of the
26		qualifications required by this chapter, the member's office is deemed vacant and the
27		governor shall appoint another individual for the remainder of the term.
28	<u>43-3</u>	6.1-04. Board members - Compensation.
29	Eac	n member of the board of soil classifiers is entitled to receive compensation in the
30	amount	established by the board, but not exceeding one hundred thirty-five dollars per day, plus

- 1 reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers, if the member is attending
- 2 <u>meetings or performing duties directed by the board.</u>
- 3 **43-36.1-05. Board members Removal.**
- 4 Upon a showing of good cause, the governor may remove any member of the board of soil
- 5 classifiers for misconduct, incompetency, or neglect of duty.
- 6 <u>43-36.1-06. Election of chairman Meetings.</u>
- 7 1. Annually, the board of soil classifiers shall elect one member to serve as the chairman.
- 8 <u>2. The chairman shall call all meetings of the board and shall call a special meeting</u>
- 9 <u>within seven days, if petitioned to do so by two members of the board.</u>
- 10 <u>3. The board shall meet at least once every six months.</u>
- 11 **43-36.1-07.** Board Powers.
- 12 <u>The board of soil classifiers may:</u>
- 13 <u>1. Expend moneys collected pursuant to this chapter for its administration;</u>
- 14 <u>2. Employ, bond, and compensate necessary personnel;</u>
- 3. Accept gifts, grants, and donations of money, property, and services to carry out this
   chapter;
- 17 <u>4.</u> <u>Contract with any person for any lawful purpose;</u>
- 18 <u>5.</u> <u>Sue and be sued; and</u>
- 19 <u>6.</u> <u>Do all things necessary and proper to enforce and administer this chapter.</u>

- 21 <u>1.</u> The board of soil classifiers shall adopt a code of ethics that is applicable to all
- 22 <u>individuals registered under this chapter.</u>
- 23 <u>2. The board shall develop and make available on its website a list of each course, by</u>

- 25 <u>a. Currently offered by an accredited institution of higher education in this state and</u>
  26 <u>in the bordering states; and</u>
- b. Determined by the board to provide academic preparation appropriate to the
   classification of soils.

Certificate of registration - Replacement. 21 If a certificate of registration must be replaced, the board of soil classifiers shall issue 22 another. The board may charge a replacement fee in an amount not exceeding twenty-five 23 dollars. 24 43-36.1-20. Code of ethics - Distribution - Revisions. 25 The board of soil classifiers shall provide an electronic or a printed copy of the code of 26 ethics to each individual registered as a soil classifier and shall provide notification of any 27 revision electronically, or by first-class mail if requested by the soil classifier. 28 43-36.1-21. Complaint - Hearing. 29 A person may file a complaint with the board of soil classifiers regarding the activities of a 30 registered soil classifier. Unless the complaint is dismissed by the board as frivolous, the 31 complaint must be heard by the board in accordance with chapter 28-32.

8	SECTION 4. REPEAL. Chapter 43-36 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
9	SECTION 5. CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR SOIL CLASSIFIERS - REPORT TO
10	<b>LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.</b> Before July 1, 2016, the board of soil classifiers, in conjunction
11	with the director of the school of natural resource sciences at North Dakota state university, or
12	the director's designee, shall review advances in the field of soil classification, as well as
13	anticipated changes in the manner of classifying soils, with a view to determining the feasibility
14	and desirability of requiring continuing education as a condition of registration renewal for soil
15	classifiers. The board shall present its conclusions and recommendations to the legislative
16	management.
