- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 61-42 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 2 to the creation of the Missouri River empower advisory council.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 61-42 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

# 61-42-01. Missouri River empower advisory council - Generally.

The Missouri River comprises the vast majority of surface water flow in the state and isessential for providing provides the water supply for people, industry, irrigation, agriculture, energy, fish and wildlife, and recreational opportunities. A Missouri River empower advisory council is established to create a unified vision and voice for North Dakota and its coordinate communication among stakeholders regarding the use and management of the Missouri River, and to advise the governor; and legislative assembly, and state agencies on issues concerning the Missouri River. A member or employee of the council may not represent to any person that the council has the authority to negotiate on behalf of the state.

7	<u>4.</u>	All other state agencies shall provide assistance to the council as requested.			
8	<u>——5.</u>	The chairman of the legislative management shall appoint to the council as voting			
9		members three legislative members to include at least one member of the minority			
10		party.			
11	4.	All appointed members shall serve for a term of four years or until their successors are			
12	I	appointed and qualified. Terms expire on the first day of July. The terms of appointed			
13		members must be staggered so that the expiration of terms of at least four members			
14		expire each yearis evenly distributed. Appointed members may be reappointed for one			
15		additional termsterm and serve at the pleasure of the governor.			
16	<u>6.5.</u>	The governor or the governor's designee is chairman of the council.			
17	<del>7.</del> 6.	The Except for the members appointed by the chairman of the legislative management,			
18	ı	members of the council are entitled to receive mileage and expenses at the rates and			
19		under the terms as provided by law for state employees. The Except for the members			
20		appointed by the chairman of the legislative management, the state water commission			
21		shall pay the expenses of council members. The legislative council shall pay the			
22		compensation and expense reimbursement for the legislative members.			
23	<u>8.7.</u>	The state water commission shall provide staffing and support services to the council.			
24	61-42-03. Duties - Report to legislative assembly.				
25	<u>1.</u>	The council shall hold meetings at least twice per year, or as often as the chairman			
26		deems necessary. The meetings must be open to the public and provide an			
27	I	opportunity for the public to present issues or concerns to the council. The council			
28		shall provide the governor, and legislative assembly, and state agencies with			
29		recommendations related to issues needing to be studied or addressed and relating to			
30		the protection and use of the Missouri River and operations of the reservoirs. The			
31		council shall gather input to build consensus, collaboration, and partnership			

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1 opportunities to promote and advocate for North Dakota and its stakeholders' rights 2 and interests in the Missouri River. The council shall recommend ways to strengthen 3 the state's working relationship with the United States army corps of engineers, in 4 order to improve the state's negotiating position with the United States army corps of 5 engineers. 6 2. The county and stakeholder appointed representatives shall work to understand and 7 represent grassroots efforts being undertaken by organizations and individuals. 8 <u>3.</u> Any recommendations developed by the council must receive support from tennine 9 voting members before submission to the governor, or legislative assembly, or state 10 agencies. 11 <u>4.</u> The council may establish working groups and collaborate with organizations to make 12 recommendations erto accomplish its objectives to protect fairly represent all interests 13 and rights of North Dakota and stakeholders in the Missouri River. This includes the 14 eight authorized purposes identified in the Flood Control Act of 1944 and implemented 15 by the United States army corps of engineers in theirits master manual, along with 16 erosion and sedimentation, the management of federal lands, and any other existing 17 or potentially beneficial uses. 18 <u>5.</u> The council shall report accomplishments, ongoing activities, and potential

legislation recommendations to the legislative assembly.

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
