ENGROSSED SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4019

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to study the feasibility and 2 desirability of utilizing state funds to provide procuring health insurance, workers' compensation 3 insurance, or other benefits tofor volunteer firefighters, volunteer emergency medical service 4 personnel, and volunteer ambulance workers across the state, including determining whether 5 the community volunteers would be covered in the case of an accident or injury, the scope and 6 conditions of coverage, and the overall cost to insure community volunteers. 7 WHEREAS, volunteer firefighters, volunteer emergency medical service personnel, and 8 volunteer ambulance workers are a vital resource regarding the administering administration of 9 aid to others in times of crisis; and 10 **WHEREAS**, it is important to offer protection and peace of mind to volunteers, and their 11 families, who willingly place themselves in harm's way for the benefit of those in need; and 12 WHEREAS, a failure to look out for the health and well-being of volunteers may have a 13 negative impact on those individuals' willingness to continue to fill vital volunteer roles in the

14 future to the detriment of the entire state;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

17 That the Legislative Management study the feasibility and desirability of utilizing state-18 funds to provide procuring health insurance, workers' compensation insurance, or other 19 benefits tofor volunteer firefighters, volunteer emergency medical service personnel, and 20 volunteer ambulance workers across the state, including determining whether the community 21 volunteers would be covered in the case of an accident or injury, the scope and conditions of 22 coverage, and the overall cost to insure community volunteers; and 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Management report its findings and

recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to

25 the Sixty-fifth Legislative Assembly.
