- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the information
- 2 technology department; to provide appropriations to certain agencies for desktop support
- 3 services; to provide a legislative report; to provide a statement of legislative intent; to provide for
- 4 transfers; to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century
- 5 Code, relating to centralized desktop support services; and to amend and reenact the new
- 6 section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code as created by section 8 of Senate
- 7 Bill No. 2326, as approved by the sixty-fourth legislative assembly, relating to the mandatory
- 8 disclosure of information to the information technology department.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the information technology department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the information technology department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, as follows:

26 2017-19 biennium. The information technology department shall report to the appropriations

27 committees of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the

biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.

SECTION 3. HEALTH DATA STUDY - REPORT TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

30 **COMMITTEE.** The health information technology office line item includes the sum of \$500,000,

from special funds, federal funds, or other funds, for the purpose of hiring a consultant to

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- 1 provide a health data study, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. 2 Before July 1, 2016, the information technology department shall report the findings of the 3 consultant to the information technology committee. 4 **SECTION 4. TRANSFERS.** Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director of the office of 5 management and budget shall make transfers of funds between line items in section 1 of this 6 Act for the information technology department as may be requested by the chief information 7 officer as determined necessary for the development and implementation of information 8 technology projects. 9 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - RADIO COMMUNICATIONS. It is the intent of the 10 sixty-fourth legislative assembly that the information technology department be responsible for 11 the oversight of the installation of any statewide radio communications equipment by an 12 executive branch state agency in the most cost-effective manner. It is further the intent of the 13 sixty-fourth legislative assembly that the information technology department develop a process 14 to implement the recommendations of the North Dakota statewide radio system assessment 15 and evolution study as presented to the statewide interoperability executive committee. 16 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** The new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century 17 Code as created by section 8 of Senate Bill No. 2326, as approved by the sixty-fourth legislative 18 assembly, is amended and reenacted as follows: 19 State agencies - Mandatory provision of information - Confidentiality. 20 The information technology department may request from any state agency: 21 All information required by 20 U.S.C. 9871(e)(2)(D); and a. 22 Any other educational information the statewide longitudinal data system b. 23 committee determines is required for a longitudinal data system to comply with 24 state or federal law-; and 25 Unemployment insurance wage data from job service North Dakota for education 26 and workforce development program evaluations, except that job service North 27 Dakota may not disclose any data identifying an individual.
 - Subject to applicable restrictions on the use and disclosure of confidential information required to comply with federal and state privacy laws, any state agency receiving a request for information under subsection 1 shall provide the information at the time and in the manner required by the information technology department.

1 SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 2 and enacted as follows: 3 Required use of centralized desktop support services. 4 1. The following state agencies shall obtain centralized desktop support services from 5 the information technology department: 6 Office of administrative hearings. <u>a.</u> 7 Office of the governor. b. 8 Commission on legal counsel for indigents. <u>C.</u> 9 <u>d.</u> Public employees retirement system. 10 North Dakota university system office. <u>e.</u> 11 f. Department of career and technical education. 12 Department of financial institutions. g. 13 Department of veterans' affairs. h. 14 Aeronautics commission. <u>i.</u> 15 į. <u>Tobacco prevention and control executive committee.</u> 16 <u>k.</u> Council on the arts. 17 Agriculture commissioner. <u>l.</u> 18 <u>m.</u> Department of labor and human rights. 19 Indian affairs commission. <u>n.</u> 20 Protection and advocacy project. <u>0.</u> 21 Secretary of state. <u>p.</u> 22 State treasurer. q. 23 State auditor. <u>r.</u> 24 Securities department. <u>S.</u> 25 The office of management and budget, after receiving advice from the information 2. 26 technology department, shall establish policies and quidelines for the delivery of 27 desktop support services, including the transition from existing systems to functional 28 consolidation, with consideration given to the creation of efficiencies, cost-savings, 29 and improved quality of service. For purposes of this section "desktop support 30 services" means technical assistance and device management relating to the use of 31 personal computers and peripheral devices.

- 1 **SECTION 8. APPROPRIATION DESKTOP SUPPORT.** The funds provided in this section,
- 2 or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the
- 3 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds and other
- 4 income to the agencies named for the purpose of defraying the expenses of desktop support
- 5 services provided by the information technology department, for the biennium beginning July 1,
- 6 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
