- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.2, 15.1-21-02.4, and 15.1-21-02.5
- 2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to high school graduation requirements.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 15.1-21-02.2. High school graduation Minimum requirements.
- 7 Except as provided in section 15.1-21-02.3, the following twenty-two units of high school
- 8 coursework constitute the minimum requirement for high school graduation:
- 9 1. Four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature,
- 10 composition, and speech;
- 11 2. Three units of mathematics, which may include one unit of computer science approved
- by the superintendent of public instruction;
- 13 3. Three units of science, including:
- a. One unit of physical science;
- b. One unit of biology; and
- 16 c. (1) One unit of any other science; or
- 17 (2) Two one-half units of any other science;
- 18 4. Three units of social studies, including:
- a. One unit of United States history;
- b. (1) One-half unit of United States government and one-half unit of economics;
