1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the office of the

2 secretary of state and public printing; to provide an exemption; to amend and reenact sections

3 54-09-04 and 54-09-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to information preparation

4 fees and confidential information in filed records; and to provide a statement of legislative intent.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 7 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 8 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 9 other income, to the secretary of state for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 10 secretary of state and public printing, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending 11 June 30, 2019, as follows: 12 Subdivision 1.

21	SECTION 4. EXEMPTION - GENERAL SERVICES OPERATING FUND. Any unexpended				
22	and unobligated balance remaining in the secretary of state's general services operating fund				
23	on June 30, 2017, is not subject to the provisions of section 54-09-08, and any unexpended				
24	funds are available and may be expended by the secretary of state during the biennium				
25	beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.				
26	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 54-09-04 of the North Dakota Century				
27	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:				
28	7. For preparing any listing or compilation of any information recorded or filed in the				
29	office of the secretary of state, an amount established by the secretary of state to-				
30	recover the actual cost for	assembling and provid	ding the information in	the format	
31	requested forty dollars for e	each record type reque	ested. Unless otherwis	e agreed to by	

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1	the secretary of state, the information shall be provided in an electronic format. If				
2	provided in a paper format, an additional fee of fifty cents per page may be charged.				
3	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 54-09-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
4	amended and reenacted as follows:				
5	54-09-12. Confidential information in filed records.				
6	<u>1.</u>	A social security number or federal tax identification number disclosed or contained in			
7		any record filed with the secretary of state is confidential. However, a social security			
8		number or federal tax identification number may be released as authorized in this			
9		section or by other state or federal law.			
10	<u>2.</u>	The secretary of state shall delete or obscure a social security or federal tax			
11		identification number before a copy of any record is released to the public. A filing			
12		office or an officer or employee of the filing office The secretary of state, or an			
13		employee, agent, or contractor of the secretary of state's office, may not be held civilly			
14		or criminally liable for the inadvertent disclosure of a social security or federal tax			
15		identification number if the filer has placed the number in an improper field on the form			
16		prescribed by the secretary of state or the filer submitted a filing other than on the form			
17		prescribed by the secretary of state.			
18	<u>3.</u>	The secretary of state, or an employee, agent, or contractor of the secretary of state's			
19		office, may release a social security number or federal tax identification number to			
20		another public entity or its agents, employees, or contractors if disclosure is necessary			
21		for the receiving entity to perform its duties and responsibilities. The receiving public			
22		entity and its agents, employees, and contractors shall maintain the confidential status			
23		of the social security number or federal tax identification number.			
24	SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - VOTING SYSTEM AND ELECTRONIC				
25	POLLBOOKS. It is the intent of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly that, within the funding				
26	appropriated to the secretary of state for the 2017-19 biennium, the secretary of state, to the				
27	extent possible, purchase equipment necessary for the implementation of a voting system to be				
28	utilized by the secretary of state and county offices in the polling places of the state, and for the				
29	procurement and implementation of electronic pollbooks to be utilized statewide in all polling				
30	places.
