1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
 2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and the North Dakota vision
 3 services - school for the blind; to create and enact a new section to chapter 25-06 and a new
 4 section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the school for the blind
 5 fund and the school for the deaf fund; to repeal section 6-09-45 of the North Dakota Century
 6 Code and section 13 of chapter 49 of the 2015 Session Laws, relating to a required transfer
 7 from the Bank of North Dakota and a contingent appropriation; to provide exemptions; to
 8 provide for a transfer; to provide for a legislative management study; and to declare an
 9 emergency.

10 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

11 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
 12 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
 13 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
 14 other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota
 15 vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the
 16 expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30,
 17 2019, as follows:

1 The 2017-19 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the
2 2019-21 biennium. The department of public instruction, school for the deaf, and North Dakota
3 vision services - school for the blind shall report to the appropriations committees of the
4 sixty-sixth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning
5 July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

6 **SECTION 4. TRANSFER - PUBLIC INSTRUCTION FUND TO STATE TUITION FUND.**

7 During the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, the office of
8 management and budget shall transfer \$4,282,905 from the public instruction fund to the state
9 tuition fund for the purpose of providing funding for integrated formula payments.

10 **SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT.** The sum of

11 ~~\$219,134,000~~\$305,546,905, included in the integrated formula payments line item in
12 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any
13 additional amount in the state tuition fund that becomes available for distribution to public
14 schools is appropriated to the department of public instruction for that purpose for the biennium
15 beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

16 **SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - FOUNDATION AID STABILIZATION FUND.** The

17 estimated income line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$270,000,000 from
18 the foundation aid stabilization fund for integrated formula payments. Of the total provided,
19 \$160,000,000 is considered to be one-time funding.

20 **SECTION 7. FUNDING TRANSFER - EXEMPTION - AUTHORIZATION.** Notwithstanding

21 section 54-16-04, the superintendent of public instruction may transfer up to \$1,200,000 from
22 the integrated formula payments line item to the grants - special education line item and up to
23 \$108,000 from the integrated formula payments line item to the grants - transportation line item,
24 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The superintendent of
25 public instruction shall notify the office of management and budget of any transfer made
26 pursuant to this section.

27 **SECTION 8. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION**

28 **CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY.** The superintendent of public instruction may
29 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education
30 ~~contracts~~-line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational
31 services that were due in the 2015-17 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly

1 supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2017. To be reimbursed under this
2 section, claims must be properly supported and filed with the superintendent of public
3 instruction by June 30, 2018.

4 **SECTION 9. GRANTS - SPECIAL EDUCATION DEFICIENCY AUTHORIZATION.** If funds
5 provided to the superintendent of public instruction in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for
6 grants - special education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019,
7 are not sufficient to meet special education contract obligations, the superintendent of public
8 instruction shall request supplemental funding from the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.

9 **SECTION 10. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING -**
10 **DISTRIBUTION.**

- 11 1. The sum of \$800,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in
12 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts
13 or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an
14 application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the
15 superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall
16 encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts
17 and special education units.
- 18 2. State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of
19 matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for
20 students participating in the medicaid program. Special education funds equal to the
21 amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the school district or special
22 education unit must be paid by the superintendent of public instruction to the
23 department of human services on behalf of the school district or unit.

24 ~~**SECTION 10. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS - GRANTS.** During the 2017-19-~~
25 ~~biennium, the superintendent of public instruction shall expend up to \$800,000 from the~~
26 ~~integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for the purpose of~~
27 ~~providing an annual grant to each eligible regional education association in order to assist each~~
28 ~~association with the cost of compensating a coordinator.~~

29 ~~1. To receive a grant under this section, each regional education association must:~~

30 ~~a. Enter a contract with an individual to serve as a coordinator, on a full time or a~~
31 ~~part time basis, for a duration of at least twelve months; and~~

1 ~~_____ b. Provide from other revenue sources at least thirty percent of the total~~
2 ~~compensation payable to the coordinator.~~

3 ~~_____ 2. The maximum grant payable to a regional education association under this section~~
4 ~~during each year of the biennium is the lesser of \$50,000 or seventy percent of the total~~
5 ~~compensation payable to the coordinator.~~

6 **SECTION 11. TRANSPORTATION GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION.**

7 1. During each year of the 2017-19 biennium, the superintendent of public instruction
8 shall calculate the payment to which each school district is entitled based on the state
9 transportation formula as it existed on June 30, 2001, except that the superintendent
10 shall provide reimbursement at the rate of:

11 a. One dollar and ~~eighteen~~three cents per mile for school buses having a capacity
12 of ten or more passengers;

13 b. ~~Fifty-five~~Forty-eight cents per mile for vehicles having a capacity of nine or fewer
14 passengers;

15 c. ~~Fifty-four~~Forty-eight cents per mile, provided;

16 (1) The student being transported is a student with a disability, as defined in
17 chapter 15.1-32;

18 (2) The student's individualized education program plan requires that the
19 student attend a public or a nonpublic school located outside the student's
20 school district of residence;

21 (3) The student is transported by an adult member of the student's family;

22 (4) The student is transported in a vehicle furnished by the student's parents;

23 (5) The student's transportation is paid for by the student's parents; and

24 (6) The reimbursement does not exceed two round trips daily between the
25 student's home and school.

26 d. ~~Fifty-four~~Forty-eight cents per mile, one way, provided:

27 (1) The student being transported resides more than two miles from the public
28 school that the student attends;

29 (2) The student is transported by an adult member of the student's family;

30 (3) The student is transported in a vehicle furnished by the student's parents;

31 and

1 (4) The student's transportation is paid for by the student's parents.

2 e. ~~Thirty-two~~ Twenty-eight cents per student for each one-way trip.

3 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall use the latest available student
4 enrollment count in each school district in applying the provisions of subsection 1.

5 ~~3. If any moneys provided for transportation payments in the grants – transportation line~~
6 ~~item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, remain after application of the formula~~
7 ~~provided for in this section, the superintendent of public instruction shall prorate the~~
8 ~~remaining amounts according to the percentage of the total transportation formula~~
9 ~~amount to which each school district is entitled.~~

10 4.3. This section does not authorize the reimbursement of any costs incurred in providing
11 transportation for student attendance at extracurricular activities or events.

12 **SECTION 12. PROGRAM GRANT POOL - CONTINUING EDUCATION GRANTS -**

13 **FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION.** ~~The sum of \$150,000, or so much of the sum as may be~~
14 ~~necessary, included in the grants – other grants line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act~~
15 ~~is provided~~ The line item entitled grants - program grants included in subdivision 1 of section 1 of
16 this Act includes \$1,735,000 for a program grant pool. The superintendent of public instruction
17 shall use the funding provided for various grant programs, including up to \$75,000, or so much
18 of the sum as may be necessary. for continuing education grants, for the biennium beginning
19 July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

20 1. The superintendent of public instruction shall award continuing education grants in
21 amounts up to \$1,200 to eligible recipients in chronological order, based on the date of
22 an individual's application. An eligible recipient must:

- 23 a. (1) Be licensed to teach by the education standards and practices board;
24 (2) Have taught in this state during each of the last three school years; and
25 (3) Be enrolled at an institution of higher education in this state in either a
26 master of education program in educational leadership or a program leading
27 to a specialist diploma in educational leadership;
- 28 b. Be pursuing the requirements for a certificate in career development facilitation;
29 or
30 c. Be pursuing a school counselor credential.

- 1 2. If any of the amount appropriated for this purpose remains after the superintendent of
2 public instruction has awarded grants to all eligible recipients, the superintendent shall
3 distribute that amount as an additional per student payment on a prorated basis,
4 according to the latest available average daily membership of each school district.

5 **SECTION 13. EXEMPTION - INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION.** Notwithstanding section
6 54-44.1-15, the department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its
7 operating account.

8 **SECTION 14. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES.** The line item entitled grants in
9 subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes ~~\$2,033,000~~\$1,737,528 for aid to public libraries, of
10 which no more than one-half ~~is to~~may be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

11 **SECTION 15. FEES DEPOSITED IN NORTH DAKOTA VISION SERVICES - SCHOOL**
12 **FOR THE BLIND OPERATING FUND.** Any moneys included in the estimated income line item
13 in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be
14 deposited in the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state
15 treasury and may be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly.

16 **SECTION 16. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - HIGHER EDUCATION INTERPRETER GRANT**
17 **PROGRAM.** The grants line item contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the
18 purpose of providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher
19 education with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or
20 hard of hearing, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. Moneys
21 appropriated for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11. Funds must be distributed
22 pursuant to the provisions of this section:

- 23 1. The school for the deaf shall develop a formula to determine the grant amount for
24 which an institution is eligible. The formula must be based on an uniform hourly
25 reimbursement.
- 26 2. To obtain a grant under this section, an institution shall submit to the school for the
27 deaf, at the time and in the manner directed by the school, invoices showing the
28 amount expended for interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf
29 or hard of hearing.
- 30 3. The school for the deaf may not distribute more than fifty percent of the amount
31 appropriated during the first year of the biennium.

1 4. If any grant moneys remain undistributed at the end of the biennium, the school for the
2 deaf shall provide additional prorated grants to institutions that incurred, during the
3 biennium, hourly expenses in excess of the formula reimbursement level.

4 5. At the request of an institution under the control of the state board of higher education,
5 the school for the deaf shall consult with the institution and provide advice regarding
6 the provision of services most appropriate to meet a student's needs.

7 ~~**SECTION 17. OTHER GRANTS - REPORTING.** The superintendent of public instruction
8 shall continue reporting on the cost per participant and the outcomes of other grants and report
9 to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly regarding participation, cost, and outcomes of these
10 grants.~~

11 **SECTION 17. PASSTHROUGH GRANTS - APPLICATION - DISTRIBUTION -**
12 **REPORTING.** The line item entitled grants - passthrough grants included in subdivision 1 of
13 section 1 of this Act includes \$2,378,000 for passthrough grants. The superintendent of public
14 instruction shall determine the manner in which each passthrough grant is distributed.
15 Grantees, as a condition of receiving the grant, must establish performance measures to be
16 reviewed by the superintendent of public instruction. Grantees shall report to the superintendent
17 of public instruction regarding performance based on the measures before October 1, 2018.
18 The superintendent of public instruction shall report to the appropriations committees of the
19 sixty-sixth legislative assembly regarding funds granted, performance measures established for
20 each grantee, and whether grantees met performance expectations.

21 **SECTION 18. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.**
22 During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the feasibility
23 and desirability of combining services for any or all English language learner programs,
24 distance learning programs, regional education agencies, teacher center networks, adult
25 learning centers, career and technical education programs, education technology services,
26 continuing education for counselors, the North Dakota leadership and educational
27 administration development center, and the teacher mentoring program. The legislative
28 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation
29 necessary to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.

30 **SECTION 19.** A new section to chapter 25-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
31 and enacted as follows:

1 **School for the blind fund.**

2 The school for the blind fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received
3 pursuant to section 2 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota, revenues received from
4 services and leases, and contributions must be deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund are to
5 be used pursuant to legislative appropriation for the provision of services under this chapter.

6 **SECTION 20.** A new section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
7 and enacted as follows:

8 **School for the deaf fund.**

9 The school for the deaf fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received
10 pursuant to section 2 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota and all revenues received
11 from the lease of buildings and the provision of meals and services, including interpreter
12 services, must be deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund are to be used pursuant to
13 legislative appropriation for provision of services under this chapter.

14 **SECTION 21. REPEAL.** Section 6-09-45 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.

15 **SECTION 22. REPEAL.** Section 13 of chapter 49 of the 2015 Session Laws is repealed.

16 **SECTION 23. EMERGENCY.** Sections 7 and 22 of this Act are declared to be emergency
17 measures.
