- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-27-03.1 and 15.1-27-04.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the determination of state aid payable to school districts.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-27-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
