- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the creation of a task force on the prevention of sexual abuse of
- 2 children; and to provide a report to the legislative management.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 SECTION 1. TASK FORCE ON PREVENTION OF SEXUAL ABUSE OF CHILDREN -
- 5 REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNOR.
 - During the 2017-18 interim, a task force on the prevention of sexual abuse of children shall gather information concerning child sexual abuse throughout the state and develop recommendations for legislation to reduce child sexual abuse.
 - 2. The task force consists of the following members:
 - a. One member of the senate and one member of the public, appointed by the senate majority leader;
 - b. One member of the senate and one member of the public, appointed by the senate minority leader;
 - c. One member of the house of representatives and one member of the public, appointed by the house majority leader;
 - d. One member of the house of representatives and one member of the public, appointed by the house minority leader;
 - e. One member of the senate and one member of the house of representatives

 appointed by the chairman of the legislative management. One legislator must be

 a member of the majority party and one legislator must be a member of the

 minority party;
 - b. The <u>executive</u> director of the department of human services, or a <u>designee of</u> the <u>directorexecutive director's designee;</u>

16		des	ignee, shall convene the task force. The task force shall elect a presiding officer by
17		a m	ajority vote of the membership of the task force. The task force shall meet at the
18		call	of the presiding officer.
19	<u>3.4.</u>	The	task force shall:
20		a.	Gather information concerning child sexual abuse throughout the state;
21		b.	Receive reports and testimony from individuals, state and local agencies,
22			community-based organizations, and other public and private organizations;
23		C.	Create goals for state policy that would prevent child sexual abuse; and
24		d.	Submit a final report with its recommendations to the governor and the legislative
25			management.

27		cha	nges and methods to foster cooperation among state agencies and between the
28		stat	e and local governments in adopting and implementing a policy addressing sexual
29		abu	se of children which may include age-appropriate curriculum for students in
30		prek	kindergarten through grade five; training for school personnel on child sexual
31		ahu	se: educational information to parents or quardians provided in school handbooks

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1	regarding the warning signs of a child being abused, along with any needed
2	assistance, referral, or resource information; available counseling and resources for
3	students affected by sexual abuse; and emotional and educational support for a child
4	of abuse to continue to be successful in school.
