## ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2023

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public employees  
2 retirement system; to provide for a report to the legislative assembly; and to provide for  
3 transfers.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds  
6 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys from special funds from income to  
7 the public employees retirement system for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the public  
8 employees retirement system, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30,  
9 2021, as follows:

1       **SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO**

2       **SIXTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The following amounts reflect the one-time  
3 funding items approved by the sixty-fifth legislative assembly for the 2017-19 biennium and the  
4 2019-21 biennium one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

9       The 2019-21 biennium one-time funding amounts are not part of the entity's base budget for  
10 the 2021-23 biennium. The public employees retirement system shall report to the  
11 appropriations committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time  
12 funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

13       **SECTION 3. LINE ITEM TRANSFERS.** Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director of  
14 the office of management and budget shall transfer appropriation authority from the  
15 contingencies line item in section 1 of this Act to any other line item as requested by the public  
16 employees retirement system board. The agency shall notify the legislative council of any  
17 transfers made pursuant to this section.

18       **SECTION 4. PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM - HOSPITAL AND MEDICAL**  
19 **BENEFITS COVERAGE - REPORT TO SIXTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** During  
20 the 2019-21 interim, the public employees retirement system board shall solicit and receive bids  
21 for the 2021-23 biennium hospital benefits coverage and medical benefits coverage for state  
22 employees under section 54-52.1-04. The request for proposal must include an option for  
23 coverage through a self-insurance plan. The board may not enter a contract for hospital benefits  
24 coverage or medical benefits coverage for the 2021-23 biennium until the board reports to and  
25 receives input from the sixty-seventh legislative assembly. The report must provide comparative  
26 information and the board's evaluation of the bids received, including information on the  
27 self-insurance option.
