

**FIRST ENGROSSMENT  
with House Amendments  
ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2140**

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 19-24.1 of the North Dakota  
2 Century Code, relating to the disclosure of registered qualifying patients to the bureau of  
3 criminal investigation; and to amend and reenact section 62.1-04-04 of the North Dakota  
4 Century Code, relating to producing a concealed weapon license upon request.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 19-24.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created  
7 and enacted as follows:

8 **Data - Disclosure - Bureau of criminal investigation.**

9 Notwithstanding section 19-24.1-37, upon request from the bureau of criminal investigation,  
10 the department shall disclose the name, date of birth, and driver's license number of all  
11 registered qualifying patients for the sole purpose of determining eligibility and compliance with  
12 chapter 62.1-04.

13 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 62.1-04-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
14 amended and reenacted as follows:

15 **62.1-04-04. Producing license ~~on demand~~upon request.**

- 16 1. Every individual while carrying a concealed firearm or dangerous weapon, for which a  
17 license to carry concealed is required, shall have on one's person the license issued  
18 by this or another state and shall give it to any active law enforcement officer for an  
19 inspection upon ~~demand~~request by the officer. The failure of any individual to give the  
20 license to the officer is prima facie evidence the individual is illegally carrying a firearm  
21 or dangerous weapon concealed.
- 22 2. Every individual carrying a concealed firearm under the authority granted in  
23 subsection 2 of section 62.1-04-02 shall inform a law enforcement officer of the

1 individual's possession of a concealed weapon upon the initiation of a traffic stop or  
2 any other in-person contact initiated by a law enforcement officer.

3 3. Every individual carrying a concealed firearm under the authority granted in  
4 subsection 2 of section 62.1-04-02 must have on one's person a valid driver's license  
5 or nondriver identification card issued by the department of transportation or a digital  
6 image of one's valid driver's license or nondriver identification card on a mobile device  
7 and shall provide the license or card to any law enforcement officer for inspection  
8 upon ~~demand~~request by the officer.

9 4. If, within thirty days of the alleged violation, an individual produces satisfactory  
10 evidence of a valid license to carry a concealed weapon, a valid driver's license, or a  
11 nondriver identification card issued by the department of transportation in effect at the  
12 time of the alleged violation of this section to the office of the prosecutor responsible  
13 for prosecuting the matter, that individual may not be found in violation of this section.
