- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to taxidermist and meat processor certifications for transporting big
- 3 game animals in the state from areas with documented cases of chronic wasting disease.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

<u>Taxidermist and meat processor certification - Processing restricted big game</u> animals - License to transport.

- 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an individual licensed to practice taxidermy pursuant to section 20.1-03-12 or an individual registered as a meat processor pursuant to section 4.1-31-16 may complete and receive certification in a knowledge and skills test administered by the state veterinarian for the safe handling, sterilization, and processing of the whole carcass or parts of a carcass of white-tailed deer, mule deer, moose, or elk from an area with documented cases of chronic wasting disease.
 - 2. An individual licensed to practice taxidermy in the state and who has received certification under subsection 1 may process for taxidermy purposes the whole carcass or parts of a carcass of white-tailed deer, mule deer, moose, or elk transported within the state or into the state from an area with documented cases of chronic wasting disease.
 - 3. An individual registered as a meat processor in the state and who has received certification under subsection 1 may process the whole carcass or parts of a carcass of white-tailed deer, mule deer, moose, or elk transported within the state or into the state from an area with documented cases of chronic wasting disease. A meat processor shall dispose of the spinal column of any processed animal carcass.

- 1 An individual may transport for taxidermy or meat processing purposes the carcass or 2 parts of a carcass of white-tailed deer, mule deer, moose, or elk within the state or into 3 the state from an area with documented cases of chronic wasting disease. An 4 individual under this subsection shall file information as required by the state 5 veterinarian or the director including the name, address, license or registration 6 number, and contact information of the licensed and certified taxidermist or the 7 registered and certified meat processor in the state who will be processing the carcass 8 and the location where the big game animal was taken.
 - <u>5.</u> The director shall adopt rules to implement this section.
