### **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1426**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact four new sections to chapter 43-20 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to regulation of dental therapists; and to amend and reenact sections
- 3 43-20-01.1 and 43-20-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to dental therapist
- 4 definition and unlawful practice of dental hygiene, dental therapy, and dentistry.

### 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

#### 8 **43-20-01.1. Definitions.**

- 9 As used in this chapter and chapter 43-28, unless the context otherwise requires:
- "Dental assistant" means an individual who provides dental assistance under the
   supervision of a dentist and within the scope of practice established by rule and
   section 43-20-13.
- 13 2. "Dental hygienist" means an individual licensed to practice dental hygiene.
- 14 3. <u>"Dental therapist" means an individual licensed to practice dental therapy.</u>
- 15 <u>4.</u> "Federally qualified health center look-alike" means a community-based health care
- 16 provider that meets the requirements of the federal health resources and services
- administration health center program but does not receive health center program
   funding.
- 19 <u>5.</u> "Qualified dental assistant" means an individual registered as a qualified dental
   20 assistant to provide dental assistance as established by rule.
- 4.6. "Registered dental assistant" means an individual registered as a registered dental
  assistant to provide dental assistance as established by rule.
- 23 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 24 amended and reenacted as follows:

1	43-20-08. Unlawful to practice without license or registration.							
2	A person may not practice dental therapy or dental hygiene or practice as a registered or							
3	qualified	qualified dental assistant in the state, without first obtaining from the board a license or						
4	registrat	registration. A person may not practice as a dental assistant outside the scope of practice						
5	established by the board by rule and section 43-20-13.							
6	SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 43-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

9	<u>1.</u>	<u>Exc</u>	cept a	s otherwise specified in this chapter, an individual seeking to practice dental				
10		<u>the</u>	therapy in this state shall apply to the executive director of the board on forms and in					
11		<u>the</u>	the manner prescribed by the board and using the processes for licensing of dentists					
12		and	and dental hygienists. The board shall grant a license to practice dental therapy to an					
13		applicant who has met the following requirements:						
14		<u>a.</u>	The	applicant is a graduate of a board-approved dental therapy education				
15			prog	gram.				
16			<u>(1)</u>	In determining whether to approve an education program, the board shall				
17				consider whether the program is accredited by the American dental				
18				association's commission on dental accreditation.				
19			<u>(2)</u>	If, after a review under paragraph 1 the board does not approve a dental				
20				therapy education program, and the applicant graduated from or is enrolled				
21				in a dental therapy education program before January 1, 2020, the board				
22				shall consider whether the education program is approved by a regulatory				
23				board of another jurisdiction and whether the program's education is				
24				comparable to an accredited program, including any postgraduation				
25				education the applicant may have obtained to achieve a comparable				
26				education.				
27		<u>b.</u>	<u>The</u>	applicant passed a board-approved examination to demonstrate competency				
28			<u>in d</u>	ental therapy.				
29		<u>C.</u>	<u>Wit</u> l	hin one year of submitting the application, the applicant passed a written				
30			<u>exa</u>	mination on the laws and rules governing the practice of dentistry in this state.

1		<u>d.</u>	The applicant completed five hundred hours of dental therapist clinical practice			
2			under the direct or indirect supervision of a dentist which may be completed			
3			during or after the applicant's education program or a combination of both.			
4			Supervised clinical practice under this subdivision for the purpose of qualifying for			
5			licensure is not a violation of section 43-20-08.			
6		<u>e.</u>	Grounds for denial of the application under section 43-20-05 do not exist.			
7		<u>f.</u>	The applicant has met any requirement for licensure established by the board by			
8			rule.

14	Dental therapists - Limitations on practice.					
15	<u>1.</u>	A dental therapist may not practice dental therapy unless the dental therapist is an				
16		em	employee or contracted provider of:			
17		<u>a.</u>	A federally qualified health center or a federally qualified health center look-alike.			
18		<u>b.</u>	A not-for-profit or governmental dental practice or organization that serves			
19			primarily low-income and underserved individuals.			
20		<u>C.</u>	An organization providing services on behalf of or under the authorization of			
21			Indian health services, a tribal entity providing health care under the federal			
22			Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act of 1975 [Pub. L.			
23			No. 93-638; 88 Stat. 2203; 25 U.S.C. 5301 et seq.], or other organization			
24			providing services to members of a federally recognized Indian tribe in this state.			
25	<u>2.</u>	To the extent authorized by the organization and the supervising dentist, a dental				
26		the	rapist employed by or under contract with an organization described in			
27		<u>sub</u>	subsection 1 may provide services in a community setting, including a school, nursing			
28		hor	ne, veterans' facility, or dental clinic.			
29	SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 43-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is created					
30	and enacted as follows:

2	<u>1.</u>	Unless restricted or prohibited by the supervising dentist in the written collaborative				
3		ma	nagement agreement, a dental therapist may perform the following services under			
4		the supervision of a supervising dentist:				
5		<u>a.</u>	The dental therapy services listed in the American dental association's			
6			commission on dental accreditation's accreditation standards for dental therapy			
7			education programs;			
8		<u>b.</u>	Processing radiographic images;			
9		<u>C.</u>	Fabricating soft occlusal guards;			
10		<u>d.</u>	Administration of nitrous oxide analgesics;			
11		<u>e.</u>	Nonsurgical extractions of periodontally diseased permanent teeth that exhibit			
12			plus three or grade 3 mobility and that are not impacted, fractured, unerupted, or			
13			in need of sectioning for removal;			
14		<u>f.</u>	Pulpotomy on primary teeth;			
15		<u>g.</u>	Recement permanent crown;			
16		<u>h.</u>	Intraoral suturing:			
17		<u>i.</u>	Placement of space maintainers;			
18		<u>j.</u>	All functions of a dental assistant;			
19		<u>k.</u>	Other related services and functions that are authorized by the supervising			
20			dentist within the dental therapist's scope of practice and for which the dental			
21			therapist is trained; and			
22		<u>l.</u>	Other services of a dental therapist authorized by the board by rule.			
23	<u>2.</u>	A dental therapist may not prescribe any drug. Within the parameters of the written				
24		<u>coll</u>	collaborative management agreement, within the practice of dental therapy, and with			
25		<u>the</u>	authorization of the supervising dentist, a dental therapist may provide, dispense,			
26		and administer the following drugs: analgesics, anti-inflammatories, and antibiotics. A				
27		dental therapist may not provide, dispense, or administer a narcotic drug.				
28	SECTION 6. A new section to chapter 43-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is created					
29	29 and enacted as follows:					

# 1 <u>Dental therapist supervision.</u>

- 2 Except under the supervision of a dentist and pursuant to a written collaborative
- 3 management agreement with the supervising dentist, a dental therapist may not practice dental
- 4 therapy. A dental therapist may perform dental therapy services under indirect supervision, or
- 5 under general supervision if authorized by rules adopted by the board, to the extent authorized
- 6 by the supervising dentist and consistent with protocols, conditions, and limitations contained in
- 7 <u>the collaborative management agreement. The written collaborative management agreement</u>
- 8 entered between a dentist and a dental therapist must:
- 9 <u>1.</u> Address any limitation on services established by the supervising dentist, the level of
- 10 <u>supervision required for various services or treatment settings, practice protocols,</u>
- 11 recordkeeping, managing medical emergencies, quality assurance, administering and
   12 dispensing medications, and supervision of dental assistants;
- 13 <u>2.</u> Include specific written protocols to govern situations in which the dental therapist
- encounters a patient requiring treatment that exceeds the authorized scope of practice
   of the dental therapist;
- 16 <u>3.</u> <u>Be signed and maintained by the supervising dentist and the dental therapist; and</u>
- 17 <u>4.</u> <u>Be submitted to the board upon request of the board.</u>
