1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 50-10.3 of the North Dakota Century Code,
2 relating to access to long-term care facilities; and to declare an emergency.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 50-10.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as
5 follows:

6 **50-10.3-01. Definitions.**

7 As used in this chapter, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 8 1. "Declaration of disaster or emergency" means a disaster or emergency declared by
9 the governor under chapter 37-17.1.
- 10 2. "Department" means the department of human services.
- 11 3. "Essential caregiver" means an individual identified by a resident of a long-term care
12 facility or by the resident's designated decisionmaker to provide in-person physical,
13 spiritual, or emotional support to the resident.
- 14 4. "Long-term care facility" means a skilled nursing facility, basic care facility, assisted
15 living facility, or swing-bed hospital approved to furnish long-term services.

16 **50-10.3-02. Scope.**

17 This chapter does not supersede federal authority regarding long-term care facilities or
18 prevent the department or state department of health from taking necessary actions to render
19 the state eligible for federal funds or reimbursement services provided in long-term care
20 facilities.

21 **50-10.3-03. Access to long-term care facilities for essential caregivers.**

- 22 1. The department, working jointly with the state department of health, the state long-
23 term care ombudsman, residents and tenants, families of residents and tenants, and
24 long-term care facility representatives, shall establish protocols to allow a resident of a

1 long-term care facility or the resident's designated decisionmaker designate one or
2 more individuals as the resident's essential caregivers, including during a declaration
3 of disaster or emergency. An essential caregiver shall meet the necessary
4 qualifications to enter the long-term care facility to provide in-person physical, spiritual,
5 or emotional support to a resident of a long-term care facility in accordance with the
6 protocols established under this section.

7 2. The protocols must include:

8 a. Safety measures for an essential caregiver which may include restrictions on
9 travel, enhanced testing for communicable diseases, and the necessary safety
10 equipment required to protect the health and safety of the residents of the long-
11 term care facility;

12 b. Procedures to replace an essential caregiver due to necessary circumstances,
13 including illness or death of the essential caregiver; and

14 c. A duration, not to exceed thirty days, during which a long-term care facility may
15 enter a lockdown phase for the purpose of establishing safety measures for
16 residents of the long-term care facility and essential caregivers.

17 **50-10.3-04. Additional safety requirements for residents of long-term care facilities.**

18 A long-term care facility may establish additional safety requirements to protect the
19 residents of the long-term care facility if the requirements and cost are not so burdensome or
20 onerous as to substantially prevent an essential caregiver from being able to provide in-person
21 physical, spiritual, or emotional support to a resident of the long-term care facility.

22 **50-10.3-05. Suspension of access for essential caregivers.**

23 If a long-term care facility suspends access to the long-term care facility for an essential
24 caregiver who violates the protocols established under section 50-10.3-03, the long-term care
25 facility shall allow the resident, or the resident's designated decisionmaker, to immediately
26 designate a replacement essential caregiver.

27 **SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
