- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 51 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to prohibiting covered entities from selling users' protected data without consent;
- 3 and to provide a penalty.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new chapter to title 51 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
6 enacted as follows:

7 <u>Definitions.</u>

- 8 <u>1.</u> <u>"Covered entity" means a partnership, limited liability company, corporation, or other</u>
- 9 legal entity, including a social media company, that collects and sells a user's
- 10 protected data and does business in the state.
- 11 <u>2.</u> <u>"Protected data" includes a user's location; screen name; website address; interests;</u>
- 12 <u>hometown; professional history; friends or followers; shopping habits; test scores;</u>
- 13 <u>health conditions, insurance, or interests; internet browsing history; purchases or</u>
- 14 purchase history; the number of friends or followers of the user; socioeconomic status;
- 15 religious affiliation; alcohol, tobacco, or drug usage; gambling habits; banking
- 16 relationships; residence details; children's information or household information; credit;
- 17 <u>banking and insurance policies; media usage; and relationship status.</u>
- 18 <u>3.</u> <u>"User" is an individual who provides protected data to a covered entity.</u>
- 19 **Prohibition against sale of protected data except with consent.**
- 20 <u>A covered entity may not sell a user's protected data to another person unless the user</u>
- 21 opts-in to allow the sale. To opt-in, the covered entity shall provide the user with the opportunity
- 22 to affirmatively click or select approval of the sale. The user must be given the opportunity to
- 23 opt-in to the sale of each type of protected data by individual selection. Protected data collected
- 24 and sold by the covered entity must be described clearly in plain language to the user.

1 <u>Violation - Penalties.</u>

2 <u>1.</u> A covered entity that violates this chapter is civilly liable to the user for a minimum of 3 ten thousand dollars, and the court shall order the covered entity to pay the user's 4 reasonable attorney's fees. If the covered entity knowingly violated this chapter, the 5 covered entity is civilly liable to the user for a minimum of one hundred thousand 6 dollars, the court shall order the covered entity to pay the user's reasonable attorney's 7 fees, and the court may award punitive damages. 8 <u>2.</u> A class action lawsuit may be filed for a violation of this chapter.
