1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for costs related to COVID-19 and other services;
2 to provide an exemption; and to declare an emergency.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
5 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated from federal funds to the state departments and
6 institutions of the state of North Dakota for the purpose of defraying COVID-19 and other
7 expenses for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2021,
