FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1118

A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 37-17.1-05 and a new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the governor's authority to issue executive orders and permitting a virtual meeting of the legislative management and a virtual session of the legislative assembly during a declared disaster or emergency; to amend and reenact subsection 12 of section 23-01-05 and subsection 3 of section 37-17.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the authority of the state health officer and the gubernatorial declaration of disaster or emergency; and to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 12 of section 23-01-05 of the North Dakota 10 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 12. Issue <u>any ordersa written order</u> relating to <u>a</u> disease control <u>measures</u>

 <u>deemed_measure</u> necessary to prevent the spread of <u>a</u> communicable disease.

 <u>DiseaseA disease</u> control <u>measures measure</u> may include <u>a</u> special immunization <u>activities</u> activity and decontamination <u>measures measures</u>. Written orders
 - a. The state health officer shall limit a written order issued under this section to the geographical area affected by the communicable disease. The state health officer may not issue a statewide order under this section unless the governor has declared a statewide disaster or emergency under chapter 37-17.1 and the governor consents to the order. The statewide order is limited in duration to the duration of the declared disaster or emergency unless terminated earlier pursuant to chapter 37-17.1.
 - <u>A written order</u> issued under this section shall have has the same effect as a physician's standing medical order.

1		<u>C.</u>	The state health officer mayshall apply to the district court in a judicial district
2			wherein which a communicable disease is present for an injunction canceling a
3			public eventsevent or closing places place of business. On application of the
4			state health officer showing the necessity of suchthe cancellation, the court may
5			issue an ex parte preliminary injunction, pending a full hearing.
6	SEC	CTION	2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 37-17.1-05 of the North Dakota
7	Century	Code	e is amended and reenacted as follows:
8	3.	A di	saster or emergency must be declared by executive order or proclamation of the
9		gov	ernor if the governor determines a disaster has occurred or a state of emergency
10		exis	sts. The
11		<u>a.</u>	Except as provided in subdivision b, the state of disaster or emergency shall
12			continuecontinues until the governor determines that the threat of an emergency
13			has passed or the governor determines the disaster has been dealt with to the
14			extent that emergency conditions no longer exist, whichever occurs first.
15		<u>b.</u>	If a state of disaster or emergency relating to public health is declared and in
16			effect and the legislative assembly is not in session, the legislative management
17			may meet to vote on whether the legislative management should request the
18			governor call a special session of the legislative assembly. If the governor does
19			not call a special session within seven days after the legislative management
20			sends a request to the governor, the declared state of disaster or emergency
21			relating to public health terminates thirty days after the request from the
22			legislative management was sent to the governor. If the governor calls a special
23			session within seven days after the request from the legislative management was
24			sent, the special session must be held within fifteen days of the governor's call for
25			a special session. If the legislative assembly meets to address a declared state of
26			disaster or emergency, the legislative assembly by concurrent resolution may
27			terminate, extend, or modify the state of disaster or emergency.

- <u>c.</u> The legislative assembly by concurrent resolution may terminate a state of disaster or emergency at any time.
- All executive orders or proclamations issued under this subsection must indicate the nature of the disaster or emergency, the area or areas threatened, the

1		conditions whichthat have brought it about or which make possible termination of	
2		the state of disaster or emergency. An executive order or proclamation must be	
3		disseminated promptly by means calculated to bring its contents to the attention	
4		of the general public, unless the circumstances attendant upon the disaster or	
5		emergency prevent or impede such dissemination, and it must be promptly filed	
6		promptly with the department of emergency services, the legislative council, the	
7		secretary of state, and the county or city auditor of the jurisdictions affected.	
8	SEC	CTION 3. A new subsection to section 37-17.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
9	created and enacted as follows:		
10	Notwithstanding subsection 3, if a state of disaster or emergency relating to public		
11		health is declared and in effect, the governor may not issue an executive order under	
12		this section unless the executive order specifically addresses the mitigation of the	
13		declared state of disaster or emergency relating to public health.	
14	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
15	and enacted as follows:		
16	<u>Virt</u>	ual session of the legislative management and legislative assembly during	
17	emergency or disaster.		
18	<u>1.</u>	If the legislative management meets to vote on whether the legislative management	
19		should request the governor call a special session of the legislative assembly, the	
20		legislative management may use any technology or electronic means available to	
21		conduct meetings and transact legislative business.	
22	<u>2.</u>	If the governor calls a special session of the legislative assembly to address a state of	
23		emergency or disaster or if the legislative assembly reconvenes to address a state of	
24		emergency or disaster, the legislative assembly may use any technology or electronic	
25		means available to conduct meetings and transact legislative business.	
26	<u>3.</u>	For purposes of section 7 of article IV of the Constitution of North Dakota, a meeting of	
27		the legislative assembly which occurs under this section is deemed to have occurred	
28		at the seat of the government, and all actions taken during the meeting have the same	
29		legal effect as if the members of the legislative assembly were physically present at	
30		the seat of government.	
31	SEC	CTION 5. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
