- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 23-27-04.3, 23-27-04.9, and 50-24.1-38 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to services provided by community paramedics,
- 3 community emergency medical technicians, and community advanced emergency medical
- 4 technicians; and to provide a penalty.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 23-27-04.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 23-27-04.3. Emergency medical services personnel training, testing, certification,

9 licensure, and quality review - Penalty.

10 The state health council shall adopt rules prescribing minimum training, testing, certification,

11 licensure, and quality review standards for emergency medical services personnel, including_

12 <u>community paramedics, community emergency medical technicians, and community advanced</u>

13 <u>emergency medical technicians;</u> instructors; and training institutions. Rules adopted must

14 include a definition of minimum applicable standards, a definition of emergency medical

15 services personnel, provide for a mechanism for certifying or licensing persons who have met

16 the required standards, provide a mechanism to review and improve the quality of care

17 rendered by emergency medical services personnel, and define minimum standards for

18 emergency medical services training institutions. Licensing as an emergency medical services

- 19 training institution is optional. It is a class B misdemeanor for an individual to willfully
- 20 misrepresent that individual's certification or licensing status as emergency medical services

21 personnel. Quality review and improvement information, data, records, and proceedings are not

22 subject to subpoena or discovery or introduction into evidence in any civil action.

23 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 23-27-04.9 of the North Dakota Century Code is

24 amended and reenacted as follows:

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1	23-2	27-04.9. Administration of influenza vaccinationvaccinations.
2	1.	A licensed emergency medical technician-paramedic working for a hospital or an
3		emergency medical services operation may administer the influenzaa vaccine to an
4		individual who is at least eighteen years of age if:
5		a. The physician providing oversight for the emergency medical services operation
6		or the hospital medical director has established protocols that meet department
7		standards that may be based on the advisory committee on immunization
8		practices of the federal centers for disease control and prevention; and
9		b. The emergency medical technician-paramedic has satisfactorily completed a
10		department-approved course on administering vaccines.
11	2.	If a hospital or emergency medical services operation allows the administration of
12		vaccines under this section, the hospital or emergency medical services operation
13		shall maintain records documenting the emergency medical technician-paramedic's
14		completion of the training required under subsection 1. These records are subject to
15		review by the department.
16	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 50-24.1-38 of the North Dakota Century Code is
17	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:
18	50-2	24.1-38. Health-related services - Licensed community paramedics<u>emergency</u>
19	<u>medica</u>	l services personnel.
20	<u>1.</u>	Medical assistance must cover services provided by community paramedics,
21		community advanced emergency medical technicians, community emergency medical
22		technicians, and other similarly licensed personnel who are licensed or certified under
23		section 23-27-04.3, if the services are provided to an eligible recipient as defined by
24		rule. Community paramedic, community advanced emergency medical technician, and
25		community emergency medical technician services may include health assessment,
26		chronic disease monitoring and education, immunizations and vaccinations, laboratory
27		specimen collection, followup care, comprehensive health and safety assessment,
28		wound management, assess and report compliance with established care plan,
29		medication management, and other interventions within the scope of practice for each
30		licensure level as approved by a supervising physician or advanced practice
31		registered nurse.

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1	<u>2.</u>	The department of human services shall adopt rules governing payments to licensed
2		community paramedics, advanced emergency medical technicians, and emergency
3		medical technicians for health-related services provided to recipients of medical
4		assistance, subject to necessary limitations and exclusions. A physician or an
5		advanced practice registered nurse must supervise any care provided by a licensed
6		community paramedic, an advanced emergency medical technician, or emergency
7		medical technician.
