- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 50-06-05.1 and sections
- 2 50-11.1-21, 50-11.1-22, 50-11.1-23, and 50-11.1-24 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 3 to the four-year old program approval and the North Dakota early childhood council; to amend
- 4 and reenact sections 15.1-09-58 and 15.1-37-05, subdivision d of subsection 6 of section
- 5 50-11.1-02, subsection 2 of section 50-11.1-07, and section 50-11.1-10 of the North Dakota
- 6 Century Code, relating to four-year old program approval; and to repeal sections 15.1-37-01,
- 7 15.1-37-02, 15.1-37-03, 15.1-37-04, and 15.1-37-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 8 to early childhood education programs.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 10 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-09-58 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 11 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 12 15.1-09-58. Early childhood education Four-year old program Authorization -
- 13 Support.
- The board of a school district may establish an early childhood educationa four-year old
- program and, provided the program is approved by the superintendent of public-
- 16 instruction department of human services in accordance with chapter 15.1-37 section 50-11.1-21,
- 17 may support that program with:
- 18 1. Local tax revenues, other than those necessary to support the district's kindergarten
- program and the provision of elementary and high school educational services;
- 20 2. State moneys specifically appropriated for the program;
- 3. Federal funds specifically appropriated or approved for the program; and
- 4. Gifts, grants, and donations specifically given for the program.
- 23 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-37-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 24 amended and reenacted as follows:

24	SECTION 3. A new subsection to section 50-06-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
25	created	and (enact	ed as follows:			
26	To act on behalf of the department of public instruction to administer part B,						
27	section 619 of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act [Pub. L. 108-446; 229						
28	Stat. 2647; 20 U.S.C. 1411 et seq.].						
29	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Subdivision d of subsection 6 of section 50-11.1-02 of the						
30	North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

2	six years of age in any educational facility through a program approved by the				
3	superintendent of public instruction department.				
4	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 50-11.1-07 of the North Dakota				
5	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:				
6	2. Upon request of the department or its authorized agent, the state department of health				
7	or the state fire marshal, or the fire marshal's designee, shall inspect the premises for				
8	which a license, four-year old program approval, or self-declaration is applied or				
9	issued and shall report the findings to the department or the department's authorized				
10	agent.				
11	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 50-11.1-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
12	amended and reenacted as follows:				
13	50-11.1-10. Denial or revocation of license, four-year old program approval,				
14	self-declaration, or registration document - Administrative hearing.				
15	Before the department may deny any application for a license, four-year old program				
16	<u>approval</u> , self-declaration, or registration document under this chapter or before the department				
17	may revoke any license, four-year old program approval, self-declaration, or registration				
18	document, the department shall provide a written notice to the applicant, licensee, or holder of				
19	the <u>four-year old program approval</u> , self-declaration, or registration document of the reasons for				
20	the denial or revocation. The applicant, licensee, holder of a <u>four-year old program approval or</u>				
21	self-declaration, or registrant may request an administrative hearing appealing the denial or				
22	revocation in the manner provided in chapter 28-32. The applicant, licensee, holder of a				
23	self-declaration, or registrant shall make a request for hearing to the department within ten days				
24	after receipt of the notice of denial or revocation from the department.				
25	SECTION 7. Section 50-11.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted				
26	as follows:				
27	50-11.1-21. Four-year old program - Approval.				
28	1. Any person or school district operating or seeking to operate a four-year old program				
29	may request approval for a two-year period of the four-year old program from the				

<u>department</u>. The department shall approve a four-year old program if the program:

1		<u>a.</u>	Is taught by individuals licensed to teach in early childhood education by the	
2			education standards and practices board or approved to teach in early childhood	
3			education by the education standards and practices board;	
4		<u>b.</u>	Follows four-year old program requirements approved by the department;	
5		<u>C.</u>	Is in compliance with all municipal and state health, fire, and safety requirements;	
6		<u>d.</u>	Limits enrollment to children who have reached the age of four years old before	
7			August first in the year of enrollment;	
8		<u>e.</u>	Submits a nonrefundable fee of fifty dollars at the time the application is filed. All	
9			fees collected under this section must be paid to the department and must be	
10			used to defray the cost of investigating, inspecting, and evaluating applications	
11			for approval; and	
12		<u>f.</u>	Is in compliance with this chapter.	
13	<u>2.</u>	<u>In d</u>	etermining the state aid payments to which a school district is entitled, the	
14		sup	erintendent of public instruction may not count a student enrolled in a regular	
15		<u>four</u>	-year old program.	
16	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	department may investigate and inspect a four-year old program applicant or	
17		<u>four</u>	-year old program and the conditions of the premises and the qualifications of	
18		curr	ent and prospective staff. The department may use the findings of the investigation	
19		<u>and</u>	inspection to determine approval.	
20	<u>4.</u>	<u>The</u>	department may revoke the four-year old program upon proper showing that:	
21		<u>a.</u>	Any applicable conditions as prerequisites for the issuance of the approval no	
22			longer exist.	
23		<u>b.</u>	The program is no longer in compliance with the minimum standards prescribed	
24			by the department.	
25		<u>C.</u>	The program approval was issued upon fraudulent or untrue presentation.	
26		<u>d.</u>	The program has violated any rules of the department.	
27	<u>5.</u>	<u>If ar</u>	n action to revoke a four-year old program approval is appealed, the provider may	
28		con	tinue the operation of the program pending the final administrative determination or	
29		<u>unti</u>	I the approval expires, whichever occurs first.	
30	SECTION 8. Section 50-11.1-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted			
31	as follows:

6	<u>2.</u>	The term of each r	nember enumerated in subdivision I of subsection 1 is three years			
7		and begins on July	first. The terms must be staggered by lot so four of the terms			
8		expire each year.				
9	<u>3.</u>	If at any time during a member's term the member ceases to possess the				
10		qualifications requi	red by this section, the member's seat is deemed vacant and the			
11		governor shall app	oint another qualified individual to serve for the remainder of the			
12		term.				
13	<u>4.</u>	A member may no	t serve more than two consecutive terms. If an individual is			
14		appointed to comp	lete a vacancy, that service is not counted as a term, for purposes			
15		of this section, unle	ess the duration of that service exceeds one year.			
16	<u>5.</u>	The council shall n	neet at least twice each year, at the call of the chairman.

21	<u>1.</u>	Review the availab	bility and provision of early childhood services in this state;

23		childhood services	in this state;			
24	<u>3.</u>	Identify ways to as	sist with the recruitment and retention of individuals interested in			
25		working as provide	ers of early childhood services, including training and continuing			
26		education or profes	ssional development opportunities;			
27	<u>4.</u>	Seek the advice ar	nd guidance of individuals uniquely familiar with the nature, scope,			
28		and associated cha	allenges of providing early childhood services in geographically and			
29		socioeconomically	diverse settings, and develop recommendations pertaining to the			
30		short-term and lone	ger-term improvement and expansion of early childhood services in			
31		this state; and				

- 5. Provide a biennial report regarding the council's findings and recommendations to the governor and the legislative assembly.
 SECTION 10. Section 50-11.1-24 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
 50-11.1-24. North Dakota early childhood council members Reimbursements for expenses.
 Each member of the North Dakota early childhood council is entitled to receive
- 8 reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers if the member is attending
- 9 meetings or performing duties directed by the council. In addition, each member of the
- 10 legislative assembly who serves on the council is entitled to receive compensation in the
- 11 amount provided per day for members of the legislative management under section 54-35-10
- 12 for attending meetings or performing duties as directed by the council.
- 13 **SECTION 11. REPEAL.** Sections 15.1-37-01, 15.1-37-02, 15.1-37-03, 15.1-37-04, and
- 14 15.1-37-07 of the North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
