1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-03.3-01 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to the compact for a balanced budget.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-03.3-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **54-03.3-01. Adoption of compact.**

7 The state of North Dakota enacts, adopts, and agrees to be bound by the Compact for a

8 Balanced Budget with all other jurisdictions legally joining therein in the form substantially as9 follows:

ARTICLE I - DECLARATION OF POLICY, PURPOSE, AND INTENT

11 Whereas, every state enacting, adopting and agreeing to be bound by this compact intends

12 to ensure that their respective legislature's use of the power to originate a Balanced Budget

13 Amendment under Article V of the Constitution of the United States will be exercised

14 conveniently and with reasonable certainty as to the consequences thereof.

15 Now, therefore, in consideration of their expressed mutual promises and obligations, be it

16 enacted by every state enacting, adopting and agreeing to be bound by this compact, and

17 resolved by each of their respective legislatures, as the case may be, to exercise herewith all of

18 their respective powers as set forth herein notwithstanding any law to the contrary.

ARTICLE II - DEFINITIONS

20 1. "Compact" means this "Compact for a Balanced Budget".

2. "Convention" means the convention for proposing amendments organized by this

22 compact under Article V of the Constitution of the United States and, where

- contextually appropriate to ensure the terms of this compact are not evaded, any other
- 24 similar gathering or body, which might be organized as a consequence of Congress

1		receiving the application set out in this compact and claim authority to propose or
2		effectuate any amendment, alteration or revision to the Constitution of the United
3		States. This term does not encompass a convention for proposing amendments under
4		Article V of the Constitution of the United States that is organized independently of this
5		compact based on the separate and distinct application of any state.
6	3.	"State" means one of the several states of the United States. Where contextually
7		appropriate, the term "state" shall be construed to include all of its branches,
8		departments, agencies, political subdivisions, and officers and representatives acting
9		in their official capacity.
10	4.	"Member state" means a state that has enacted, adopted, and agreed to be bound to
11		this compact. For any state to qualify as a member state with respect to any other
12		state under this compact, each such state must have enacted, adopted, and agreed to
13		be bound by substantively identical compact legislation.
14	5.	"Compact notice recipients" means the archivist of the United States, the president of
15		the United States, the president of the United States Senate, the office of the secretary
16		of the United States Senate, the speaker of the United States House of
17		Representatives, the office of the clerk of the United States House of Representatives,
18		the chief executive officer of each state, and the presiding officers of each house of
19		the legislatures of the several states.
20	6.	Notice. All notices required by this compact shall be by United States certified mail,
21		return receipt requested, or an equivalent or superior form of notice, such as personal
22		delivery documented by evidence of actual receipt.
23	7.	"Balanced Budget Amendment" means the following:
24		"Article
25		Section 1. Total outlays of the government of the United States shall not exceed
26		total receipts of the government of the United States at any point in time unless
27		the excess of outlays over receipts is financed exclusively by debt issued in strict
28		conformity with this article.
29		Section 2. Outstanding debt shall not exceed authorized debt, which initially shall
30		be an amount equal to 105 percent of the outstanding debt on the effective date
31		of this article. Authorized debt shall not be increased above its aforesaid initial

amount unless such increase is first approved by the legislatures of the several
 states as provided in Section 3.

3 Section 3. From time to time, Congress may increase authorized debt to an 4 amount in excess of its initial amount set by Section 2 only if it first publicly refers 5 to the legislatures of the several states an unconditional, single subject measure 6 proposing the amount of such increase, in such form as provided by law, and the 7 measure is thereafter publicly and unconditionally approved by a simple majority 8 of the legislatures of the several states, in such form as provided respectively by 9 state law; provided that no inducement requiring an expenditure or tax levy shall 10 be demanded, offered or accepted as a guid pro guo for such approval. If such 11 approval is not obtained within sixty (60) calendar days after referral then the 12 measure shall be deemed disapproved and the authorized debt shall thereby 13 remain unchanged.

- 14 Section 4. Whenever the outstanding debt exceeds 98 percent of the debt limit 15 set by Section 2, the President shall enforce said limit by publicly designating 16 specific expenditures for impoundment in an amount sufficient to ensure 17 outstanding debt shall not exceed the authorized debt. Said impoundment shall 18 become effective thirty (30) days thereafter, unless Congress first designates an 19 alternate impoundment of the same or greater amount by concurrent resolution, 20 which shall become immediately effective. The failure of the President to 21 designate or enforce the required impoundment is an impeachable misdemeanor. 22 Any purported issuance or incurrence of any debt in excess of the debt limit set 23 by Section 2 is void.
- Section 5. No bill that provides for a new or increased general revenue tax shall become law unless approved by a two-thirds roll call vote of the whole number of each House of Congress. However, this requirement shall not apply to any bill that provides for a new end user sales tax which would completely replace every existing income tax levied by the government of the United States; or for the reduction or elimination of an exemption, deduction, or credit allowed under an existing general revenue tax.

1		Section 6. For purposes of this article, "debt" means any obligation backed by the
2		full faith and credit of the government of the United States; "outstanding debt"
3		means all debt held in any account and by any entity at a given point in time;
4		"authorized debt" means the maximum total amount of debt that may be lawfully
5		issued and outstanding at any single point in time under this article; "total outlays
6		of the government of the United States" means all expenditures of the
7		government of the United States from any source; "total receipts of the
8		government of the United States" means all tax receipts and other income of the
9		government of the United States, excluding proceeds from its issuance or
10		incurrence of debt or any type of liability; "impoundment" means a proposal not to
11		spend all or part of a sum of money appropriated by Congress; and "general
12		revenue tax" means any income tax, sales tax, or value-added tax levied by the
13		government of the United States excluding imposts and duties.
14		Section 7. This article is immediately operative upon ratification, self-enforcing,
15		and Congress may enact conforming legislation to facilitate enforcement."
16		ARTICLE III - COMPACT MEMBERSHIP AND WITHDRAWAL
17	1.	This compact governs each member state to the fullest extent permitted by their
18		respective constitutions, superseding and repealing any conflicting or contrary law.
19	2.	By becoming a member state, each such state offers, promises, and agrees to
20		perform and comply strictly in accordance with the terms and conditions of this
21		compact, and has made such offer, promise, and agreement in anticipation and
22		consideration of, and in substantial reliance upon, such mutual and reciprocal
23		performance and compliance by each other current and future member state, if any.
24		Accordingly, in addition to having the force of law in each member state upon its
25		respective effective date, this compact and each of its articles shall also be construed
26		as contractually binding each member state when:
27		a At least one other state has likewise become a member state by enacting

a. At least one other state has likewise become a member state by enacting
substantively identical legislation adopting and agreeing to be bound by this
compact; and

- b. Notice of such state's member state status is or has been seasonably received
 by the compact administrator, if any, or otherwise by the chief executive officer of
 each other member state.
- For purposes of determining member state status under this compact, as long as all
 other provisions of the compact remain identical and operative on the same terms,
 legislation enacting, adopting, and agreeing to be bound by this compact shall be
 deemed and regarded as "substantively identical" with respect to such other legislation
 enacted by another state notwithstanding:
- 9 a. Any difference in subsection 2 of article IV with specific regard to the respectively
 10 enacting state's own method of appointing its member to the commission;
- 11b.Any difference in subsection 5 of article IV with specific regard to the respectively12enacting state's own obligation to fund the commission;
- c. Any difference in subsections 1 and 2 of article VI with specific regard to the
 number and identity of each delegate respectively appointed on behalf of the
 enacting state, provided that no more than three delegates may attend and
 participate in the Convention on behalf of any state; or
- Any difference in subsection 7 of article X with specific regard to the respectively
 enacting state as to whether subsection 1 of article V of this compact shall
 survive termination of the compact, and thereafter become a continuing
 resolution of the legislature of such state applying to Congress for the calling of a
 convention of the states under Article V of the Constitution of the United States,
 under such terms and limitations as may be specified by such state.
- 23 4. When fewer than three-fourths of the states are member states, any member state 24 may withdraw from this compact by enacting appropriate legislation, as determined by 25 state law, and giving notice of such withdrawal to the compact administrator, if any, or 26 otherwise to the chief executive officer of each other member state. A withdrawal shall 27 not affect the validity or applicability of the compact with respect to remaining member 28 states, provided that there remain at least two such states. However, once at least 29 three-fourths of the states are member states, then no member state may withdraw 30 from the compact prior to its termination absent unanimous consent of all member 31 states.

1		ARTICLE IV - COMPACT COMMISSION AND COMPACT ADMINISTRATOR
2	1.	Nature of the compact commission. The compact commission ("commission") is
3		hereby established. It has the power and duty:
4		a. To appoint and oversee a compact administrator;
5		b. To encourage states to join the compact and Congress to call the Convention in
6		accordance with this compact;
7		c. To coordinate the performance of obligations under the compact;
8		d. To oversee the Convention's logistical operations as appropriate to ensure this
9		compact governs its proceedings;
10		e. To oversee the defense and enforcement of the compact in appropriate legal
11		venues;
12		f. To request funds and to disburse those funds to support the operations of the
13		commission, compact administrator, and Convention; and
14		g. To cooperate with any entity that shares a common interest with the commission
15		and engages in policy research, public interest litigation, or lobbying in support of
16		the purposes of the compact. The commission shall only have such implied
17		powers as are essential to carrying out these express powers and duties. It shall
18		take no action that contravenes or is inconsistent with this compact or any law of
19		any state that is not superseded by this compact. It may adopt and publish
20		corresponding bylaws and policies.
21	2.	Commission membership. The commission initially consists of three unpaid members.
22		Each member state may appoint one member to the commission through an
23		appointment process to be determined by their respective chief executive officer until
24		all positions on the commission are filled. Positions shall be assigned to appointees in
25		the order in which their respective appointing states became member states. The
26		bylaws of the commission may expand its membership to include representatives of
27		additional member states and to allow for modest salaries and reimbursement of
28		expenses if adequate funding exists.
29	3.	Commission action. Each commission member is entitled to one vote. The
30		commission shall not act unless a majority of its appointed membership is present,
31		and no action shall be binding unless approved by a majority of the commission's

1		appointed membership. The commission shall meet at least once a year, and may
2		meet more frequently.
3	4.	First order of business. The commission shall at the earliest possible time elect from
4		among its membership a chairperson, determine a primary place of doing business,
5		and appoint a compact administrator.
6	5.	Funding. The commission and the compact administrator's activities shall be funded
7		exclusively by each member state, as determined by their respective state law, or by
8		voluntary donations.
9	6.	Compact administrator. The compact administrator has the power and duty:
10		a. To timely notify the states of the date, time, and location of the Convention;
11		b. To organize and direct the logistical operations of the Convention;
12		c. To maintain an accurate list of all member states, their appointed delegates,
13		including contact information; and
14		d. To formulate, transmit, and maintain all official notices, records, and
15		communications relating to this compact. The compact administrator shall only
16		have such implied powers as are essential to carrying out these express powers
17		and duties; and shall take no action that contravenes or is inconsistent with this
18		compact or any law of any state that is not superseded by this compact. The
19		compact administrator serves at the pleasure of the commission and must keep
20		the commission seasonably apprised of the performance or nonperformance of
21		the terms and conditions of this compact. Any notice sent by a member state to
22		the compact administrator concerning this compact shall be adequate notice to
23		each other member state provided that a copy of said notice is seasonably
24		delivered by the compact administrator to each other member state's respective
25		chief executive officer.
26	7.	Notice of key events. Upon the occurrence of each of the following described events,
27		or otherwise as soon as possible, the compact administrator shall immediately send
28		the following notices to all compact notice recipients, together with certified conforming
29		copies of the chaptered version of this compact as maintained in the statutes of each
30		member state:
31		a. Whenever any state becomes a member state, notice of that fact shall be given;

1		b.	Once at least three-fourths of the states are member states, notice of that fact
2			shall be given together with a statement declaring that the legislatures of at least
3			two-thirds of the several states have applied for a convention for proposing
4			amendments under Article V of the Constitution of the United States, petitioning
5			Congress to call the Convention contemplated by this compact, and further
6			requesting cooperation in organizing the same in accordance with this compact;
7		C.	Once Congress has called the Convention contemplated by this compact, and
8			whenever the date, time, and location of the Convention has been determined,
9			notice of that fact shall be given together with the date, time, and location of the
10			Convention and other essential logistical matters;
11		d.	Upon approval of the Balanced Budget Amendment by the Convention, notice of
12			that fact shall be given together with the transmission of certified copies of such
13			approved proposed amendment and a statement requesting Congress to refer
14			the same for ratification by three-fourths of the legislatures of the several states
15			under Article V of the Constitution of the United States. However, in no event
16			shall any proposed amendment other than the Balanced Budget Amendment be
17			transmitted; and
18		e.	When any article of this compact prospectively ratifying the Balanced Budget
19			Amendment is effective in any member state, notice of the same shall be given
20			together with a statement declaring such ratification and further requesting
21			cooperation in ensuring that the official record confirms and reflects the effective
22			corresponding amendment to the Constitution of the United States. However,
23			whenever any member state enacts appropriate legislation, as determined by the
24			laws of the respective state, withdrawing from this compact, the compact
25			administrator shall immediately send certified conforming copies of the chaptered
26			version of such withdrawal legislation as maintained in the statutes of each such
27			withdrawing member state, solely to each chief executive officer of each
28			remaining member state, giving notice of such withdrawal.
29	8.	Coo	peration. The commission, member states, and compact administrator shall
30		coop	perate with each other and give each other mutual assistance in enforcing this
31		com	pact and shall give the chief law enforcement officer of each other member state

1 any information or documents that are reasonably necessary to facilitate the 2 enforcement of this compact. 3 9. This article does not take effect until there are at least two member states. 4 **ARTICLE V - RESOLUTION APPLYING FOR CONVENTION** 5 1. Be it resolved, as provided for in Article V of the Constitution of the United States, the 6 legislature of each member state herewith applies to Congress for the calling of a 7 convention for proposing amendments limited to the subject matter of proposing for 8 ratification the Balanced Budget Amendment. 9 Congress is further petitioned to refer the Balanced Budget Amendment to the states 2. 10 for ratification by three-fourths of their respective legislatures. 11 3. This article does not take effect until at least three-fourths of the several states are 12 member states. 13 **ARTICLE VI - DELEGATE APPOINTMENT, LIMITATIONS, AND INSTRUCTIONS** 14 1. Number of delegates. Each member state shall be entitled to one delegate as its sole-15 and exclusive representative three delegates to represent its sovereign interests at the 16 Convention as set forth in this article. 17 2. Identity of delegates. Each member state's chief executive officer, who is serving on-18 the enactment date of this compact, is appointed in an individual capacity to represent 19 his or her respective state at the Convention as its sole and exclusive delegate. The 20 governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and president pro tempore of the 21 senate of the member state who hold office at the time of the Convention, or the 22 officers' designees as identified in sworn affidavits executed by the officers, are each 23 appointed in an individual capacity to represent the member state at the Convention 24 as the member state's sole and exclusive delegates. A majority of this delegation shall 25 decide the issue at the Convention on behalf of the member state. 26 Replacement or recall of delegates. A delegate appointed hereunder may be replaced 3. 27 or recalled by the legislature of his or her respective state at any time for good cause, 28 such as criminal misconduct or the violation of this compact. If replaced or recalled, 29 any delegate previously appointed hereunder must immediately vacate the Convention 30 and return to their respective state's capital.

1	4.	Oath. The power and authority of a delegate under this article may only be exercised
2		after the Convention is first called by Congress in accordance with this compact and
3		such appointment is duly accepted by such appointee publicly taking the following
4		oath or affirmation: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I accept this appointment and
5		will act strictly in accordance with the terms and conditions of the compact for a
6		balanced budget, the constitution of the state I represent, and the Constitution of the
7		United States. I understand that violating this oath (or affirmation) forfeits my
8		appointment and may subject me to other penalties as provided by law."
9	5.	Term. The term of a delegate hereunder commences upon acceptance of appointment
10		and terminates upon the permanent adjournment of the Convention, unless shortened
11		by recall, replacement, or forfeiture under this article. Upon expiration of such term,
12		any person formerly serving as a delegate must immediately withdraw from and cease
13		participation at the Convention, if any is proceeding.
14	6.	Delegate authority. The power and authority of any delegate appointed hereunder is
15		strictly limited:
16		a. To introducing, debating, voting upon, proposing, and enforcing the Convention
17		rules specified in this compact, as needed to ensure those rules govern the
18		Convention; and
19		b. To introducing, debating, voting upon, and rejecting or proposing for ratification
20		the Balanced Budget Amendment. All actions taken by any delegate in violation
21		of this section are void ab initio.
22	7.	Delegate authority. No delegate of any member state may introduce, debate, vote
23		upon, reject, or propose for ratification any constitutional amendment at the
24		Convention unless:
25		a. Convention rules specified in this compact govern the Convention and their
26		actions; and
27		b. The constitutional amendment is the Balanced Budget Amendment.
28	8.	Delegate authority. The power and authority of any delegate at the Convention does
29		not include any power or authority associated with any other public office held by the
30		delegate. Any person appointed to serve as a delegate shall take a temporary leave of
31		absence, or otherwise shall be deemed temporarily disabled, from any other public

- office held by the delegate while attending the Convention, and may not exercise any
 power or authority associated with any other public office held by the delegate, while
 attending the Convention. All actions taken by any delegate in violation of this section
 are void ab initio.
- 9. Order of business. Before introducing, debating, voting upon, rejecting, or proposing
 for ratification any constitutional amendment at the Convention, each delegate of
 every member state must first ensure the Convention rules in this compact govern the
 Convention and their actions. Every delegate and each member state must
 immediately vacate the Convention and notify the compact administrator by the most
 effective and expeditious means if the Convention rules in this compact are not
 adopted to govern the Convention and their actions.
- 12 10. Forfeiture of appointment. If any member state or delegate violates any provision of 13 this compact, then every delegate of that member state immediately forfeits his or her 14 appointment, and shall immediately cease participation at the Convention, vacate the 15 Convention, and return to his or her respective state's capital.
- 16 11. Expenses. A delegate appointed hereunder is entitled to reimbursement of reasonable
 17 expenses for attending the Convention from his or her respective member state. No
 18 delegate may accept any other form of remuneration or compensation for service
 19 under this compact.
- 20

ARTICLE VII - CONVENTION RULES

- 21 1. Nature of the Convention. The Convention shall be organized, construed, and 22 conducted as a body exclusively representing and constituted by the several states. 23 2. Agenda of the Convention. The agenda of the Convention shall be entirely focused 24 upon and exclusively limited to introducing, debating, voting upon, and rejecting or 25 proposing for ratification the Balanced Budget Amendment under the Convention rules 26 specified in this article and in accordance with the compact. It shall not be in order for 27 the Convention to consider any matter that is outside the scope of this agenda.
- Delegate identity and procedure. States shall be represented at the Convention
 through duly appointed delegates. The number, identity, and authority of delegates
 assigned to each state shall be determined by this compact in the case of member
 states or, in the case of states that are not member states, by their respective state

1	laws. However, to prevent disruption of proceedings, no more than three delegates
2	may attend and participate in the Convention on behalf of any state. A certified
3	chaptered conforming copy of this compact, together with government-issued
4	photographic proof of identification, shall suffice as credentials for delegates of
5	member states. Any commission for delegates of states that are not member states
6	shall be based on their respective state laws, but it shall furnish credentials that are at
7	least as reliable as those required of member states.

- 8 4. Voting. Each state represented at the Convention shall have one vote, exercised by
 9 the vote of that state's delegate in the case of states represented by one delegate, or,
 10 in the case of any state that is represented by more than one delegate, by the majority
 11 vote of that state's respective delegates.
- Quorum. A majority of the several states of the United States, each present through its
 respective delegate in the case of any state that is represented by one delegate, or
 through a majority of its respective delegates, in the case of any state that is
 represented by more than one delegate, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction
 of any business on behalf of the Convention.
- 17 6. Action by the Convention. The Convention shall only act as a committee of the whole, 18 chaired by the delegate representing the first state to have become a member state, if 19 that state is represented by one delegate, or otherwise by the delegate chosen by the 20 majority vote of that state's respective delegates. The transaction of any business on 21 behalf of the Convention, including the designation of a secretary, the adoption of 22 parliamentary procedures, and the rejection or proposal of any constitutional 23 amendment, requires a quorum to be present and a majority affirmative vote of those 24 states constituting the quorum.
- 25
 7. Emergency suspension and relocation of the Convention. In the event that the chair of
 26 the Convention declares an emergency due to disorder or an imminent threat to public
 27 health and safety prior to the completion of the business on the agenda, and a majority
 28 of the states present at the Convention do not object to such declaration, further
 29 Convention proceedings shall be temporarily suspended, and the commission shall
 30 subsequently relocate or reschedule the Convention to resume proceedings in an

orderly fashion in accordance with the terms and conditions of this compact with prior
 notice given to the compact notice recipients.

3 8. Parliamentary procedure. In adopting, applying, and formulating parliamentary 4 procedure, the Convention shall exclusively adopt, apply, or appropriately adapt 5 provisions of the most recent editions of Robert's Rules of Order and the American 6 Institute of Parliamentarians Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure. In adopting, 7 applying, or adapting parliamentary procedure, the Convention shall exclusively 8 consider analogous precedent arising within the jurisdiction of the United States. 9 Parliamentary procedures adopted, applied, or adapted pursuant to this section shall 10 not obstruct, override, or otherwise conflict with this compact.

- Transmittal. Upon approval of the Balanced Budget Amendment by the Convention to
 propose for ratification, the chair of the Convention shall immediately transmit certified
 copies of such approved proposed amendment to the compact administrator and all
 compact notice recipients, notifying them respectively of such approval and requesting
 Congress to refer the same for ratification by the states under Article V of the
- Constitution of the United States. However, in no event shall any proposed
 amendment other than the Balanced Budget Amendment be transmitted as aforesaid.
- 18 10. Transparency. Records of the Convention, including the identities of all attendees and
 19 detailed minutes of all proceedings, shall be kept by the chair of the Convention or
 20 secretary designated by the Convention. All proceedings and records of the
 21 Convention shall be open to the public upon request subject to reasonable regulations
 22 adopted by the Convention that are closely tailored to preventing disruption of
- 23 proceedings under this article.
- Adjournment of the Convention. The Convention shall permanently adjourn upon the
 earlier of twenty-four hours after commencing proceedings under this article or the
 completion of the business on its agenda.

ARTICLE VIII - PROHIBITION ON ULTRA VIRES CONVENTION

- 28 1. Member states shall not participate in the Convention unless:
- a. Congress first calls the Convention in accordance with this compact; and
- 30 b. The Convention rules of this compact are adopted by the Convention as its first31 order of business.

1	2.	Any proposal or action of the Convention is void ab initio and issued by a body that is
2		conducting itself in an unlawful and ultra vires fashion if that proposal or action:
3		a. Violates or was approved in violation of the Convention rules or the delegate
4		instructions and limitations on delegate authority specified in this compact;
5		b. Purports to propose or effectuate a mode of ratification that is not specified in
6		Article V of the Constitution of the United States; or
7		c. Purports to propose or effectuate the formation of a new government. All member
8		states are prohibited from advancing or assisting in the advancement of any such
9		proposal or action.
10	3.	Member states shall not ratify or otherwise approve any proposed amendment,
11		alteration, or revision to the Constitution of the United States, which originates from
12		the Convention, other than the Balanced Budget Amendment.
13		ARTICLE IX - RESOLUTION PROSPECTIVELY RATIFYING
14		THE BALANCED BUDGET AMENDMENT
15	1.	Each member state, by and through its respective legislature, hereby adopts and
16		ratifies the Balanced Budget Amendment.
17	2.	This article does not take effect until Congress effectively refers the Balanced Budget
18		Amendment to the states for ratification by three-fourths of the legislatures of the
19		several states under Article V of the Constitution of the United States.
20	Α	RTICLE X - CONSTRUCTION, ENFORCEMENT, VENUE, AND SEVERABILITY
21	1.	To the extent that the effectiveness of this compact or any of its articles or provisions
22		requires the alteration of local legislative rules, drafting policies, or procedure to be
23		effective, the enactment of legislation enacting, adopting, and agreeing to be bound by
24		this compact shall be deemed to waive, repeal, supersede, or otherwise amend and
25		conform all such rules, policies, or procedures to allow for the effectiveness of this
26		compact to the fullest extent permitted by the constitution of any affected member
27		state.
28	2.	Date and location of the Convention. Unless otherwise specified by Congress in its
29		call, the Convention shall be held in Dallas, Texas, and commence proceedings at
30		9:00 a.m. central standard time on the sixth Wednesday after the latter of the effective

- date of article V of this compact or the enactment date of the Congressional resolution
 calling the Convention.
- 3. In addition to all other powers and duties conferred by state law which are consistent
 with the terms and conditions of this compact, the chief law enforcement officer of
 each member state is empowered to defend the compact from any legal challenge, as
 well as to seek civil mandatory and prohibitory injunctive relief to enforce this compact;
 and shall take such action whenever the compact is challenged or violated.
- 8 4. The exclusive venue for all actions in any way arising under this compact shall be in 9 the United States District Court for the northern district of Texas or the courts of the 10 state of Texas within the jurisdictional boundaries of the foregoing district court. Each 11 member state shall submit to the jurisdiction of said courts with respect to such 12 actions. However, upon written request by the chief law enforcement officer of any 13 member state, the commission may elect to waive this provision for the purpose of 14 ensuring an action proceeds in the venue that allows for the most convenient and 15 effective enforcement or defense of this compact. Any such waiver shall be limited to 16 the particular action to which it is applied and not construed or relied upon as a 17 general waiver of this provision. The waiver decisions of the commission under this 18 provision shall be final and binding on each member state.

19 5. The effective date of this compact and any of its articles is the latter of:

- a. The date of any event rendering the same effective according to its respective
 terms and conditions; or
 - b. The earliest date otherwise permitted by law.

23 6. Article VIII of this compact is hereby deemed nonseverable prior to termination of the 24 compact. However, if any other phrase, clause, sentence, or provision of this compact, 25 or the applicability of any other phrase, clause, sentence, or provision of this compact 26 to any government, agency, person, or circumstance, is declared in a final judgment to 27 be contrary to the Constitution of the United States, contrary to the state constitution of 28 any member state, or is otherwise held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, 29 such phrase, clause, sentence, or provision shall be severed and held for naught, and 30 the validity of the remainder of this compact and the applicability of the remainder of 31 this compact to any government, agency, person, or circumstance shall not be

1	affected. Furthermore, if this compact is declared in a final judgment by a court of
2	competent jurisdiction to be entirely contrary to the state constitution of any member
3	state or otherwise entirely invalid as to any member state, such member state shall be
4	deemed to have withdrawn from the compact, and the compact shall remain in full
5	force and effect as to any remaining member state. Finally, if this compact is declared
6	in a final judgment by a court of competent jurisdiction to be wholly or substantially in
7	violation of Article I, Section 10, of the Constitution of the United States, then it shall be
8	construed and enforced solely as reciprocal legislation enacted by the affected
9	member states.

Termination. This compact shall terminate and be held for naught when the compact is
 fully performed and the Constitution of the United States is amended by the Balanced
 Budget Amendment. However, notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth in this
 compact, in the event such amendment does not occur within seven years after the
 first state passes legislation enacting, adopting, and agreeing to be bound to this
 compacton or before April 12, 2031, the compact shall terminate as follows:

- a. The commission shall dissolve and wind up its operations within ninety days
 thereafter, with the compact administrator giving notice of such dissolution and
 the operative effect of this section to the compact notice recipients; and
- 19b.Upon the completed dissolution of the commission, this compact shall be20deemed terminated, repealed, void ab initio, and held for naught.
