- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-10.1-01 and 43-10.1-03.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to irrevocable itemized funeral contracts and Medicaid assets
- 3 exempt for funeral expenses.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **43-10.1-01. Definitions.**

8 As used in this chapter:

- 9 1. "Cemetery association" means any person, corporation, municipality, association, or-
- 10 organization owning, conducting, or maintaining a cemetery or plot for the burial of
 11 dead human bodies.
- "Cemetery merchandise" means all service or property to be used in funeral services
 or burials other than professional service or personal property to be used in funeral
 services.
- 15 3. "Commissioner" means the securities commissioner.
- 16 4. <u>"Irrevocable itemized funeral contract" means an irrevocable pre-need funeral service</u>
 17 <u>contract.</u>
- 18 <u>5.</u> "Licensed funeral establishment" means a funeral establishment as defined and
 19 licensed in accordance with sections 43-10-21 and 43-10-22.
- 20 5. "Person" means any natural person, firm, association, corporation, limited liability
 21 company, or agents or employees thereof.
- 22 6. "Pre-need funeral service contract" means any contract, other than an insurance
- 23 contract, under which for a specified consideration paid in advance in a lump sum or
- by installments, a person promises, upon the death of a beneficiary named or implied

- in the contract, to furnish professional service or personal property to be used in
 funeral services, or to furnish cemetery merchandise.
- 3 7. "Professional service or personal property to be used in funeral services" means all 4 personal property, services, supplies, and equipment normally performed or furnished 5 by a licensed embalmer, a licensed funeral establishment, or a cemetery association 6 including any inside interment receptacles or containers into which a dead human 7 remains may be directly placed, caskets, crypt beds, catafalgues, and all other articles 8 of merchandise incident to a funeral service, but excluding any outside interment 9 receptacles into which any inside receptacle or container will be placed, grave lots, 10 grave spaces, grave markers, monuments, tombstones, crypts, niches, and 11 mausoleums unless these items are sold by a companion agreement or in 12 contemplation of a trade or barter which includes the sale or rental of any inside 13 interment receptacles or containers into which a dead human remains may be directly 14 placed, caskets, crypt beds, catafalgues, or other articles of merchandise incident to a 15 funeral service.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10.1-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-10.1-03.1. Payments on pre-need funeral contracts to be deposited - Depository shall keep record of deposit - Personal property storage.

20 If payments are made to a person upon pre-need funeral service contracts, including 1. 21 irrevocable itemized funeral contracts, one hundred percent of the funds collected 22 under the contracts for the sale of professional service or personal property to be used 23 in funeral services and fifty percent of the funds collected under the contracts for the 24 sale of cemetery merchandise must be deposited in or transferred to a trust company 25 in this state or to a federally insured bank, credit union, or savings and loan 26 association in this state, within ten days. The deposit must be placed in a federal 27 deposit insurance corporation or national credit union administration insured certificate 28 of deposit or negotiable debt obligation of the United States government. Payments 29 received from the sale of professional service or personal property to be used in 30 funeral services or cemetery merchandise which cannot or would not be serviced by a 31 licensed funeral establishment or cemetery association in the area in which the service 1or property was sold are specifically included, regardless of whether the sales might2otherwise be considered pre-need funeral service contracts, within the payments to be3deposited under this section. If payments have been made under an irrevocable4itemized funeral contract, the money must be carried in a separate account with the5names of the depositor or transferor, cemetery association or licensed funeral6establishment, and the person making payment on behalf of the individual for whose7benefit payment is made.

- 8 The funds may be released or transferred by the bank, credit union, savings and a. 9 loan association, or trust company to the depositor upon the death of the 10 individual for whose benefit the funds were paid. A certified copy of the certificate 11 of death must be furnished to the bank, credit union, savings and loan 12 association, or trust company as prima facie evidence of death. The funds may 13 be released or transferred by the bank, credit union, savings and loan 14 association, or trust company to the person making the payment, before the 15 death of the individual for whose benefit the funds are paid, upon a five-day 16 written notice by registered or certified mail made by the bank, credit union, 17 savings and loan association, or trust company to the depositor or transferor at 18 the request of the person making the payment.
- 19 b. A purchaser of a pre-need funeral service contract may make a certain amount of 20 the pre-need funds irrevocable by designating an irrevocable amount to be used 21 to pay for the funeral of the beneficiary. The irrevocable amount may not exceed 22 the amount to pay for a funeral and recognized as an allowable asset exclusion 23 used for determining eligibility for medical assistance under section 50-24.1-02.3 24 at the time the contract is entered. A purchaser of a pre-need funeral service-25 contractan irrevocable itemized funeral contract has forty-five days from entering 26 the contract to cancel the irrevocable part of the contract by giving notice to the 27 cemetery association or licensed funeral establishment with which the contract 28 was entered. Any pre-need funeral service contract held by a cemetery 29 association or a licensed funeral establishment must be fully transferable to 30 another cemetery association or funeral establishment licensed under chapter

- 43-10 or a substantially similar law of another jurisdiction which agrees to accept
 the obligations.
- A bank, credit union, savings and loan association, or trust company receiving such a
 deposit or transfer shall keep a complete record of the deposit or transfer, showing the
 name of the depositor or transferor, name of the person making payment, name of the
 individual for whose benefit payment is made, and any other pertinent information.
- Any personal property to be used in funeral services or cemetery merchandise which
 is sold to a purchaser on the basis it will be identified and marked as belonging to such
 purchaser, and stored or warehoused for the purchaser, must be stored or
 warehoused at some location within this state.
