4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES WAIVERS - LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES SERVICES. During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall identify changes that need to be made in North-Dakota Administrative Code provisions addressing the department of human service's section-1915(c) home and community-based services waiver for individuals with intellectual disabilities and developmental disabilities, including any internal department policies or protocols relating to eligibility or screening, to better satisfy the intent of chapter 25-01.2 and 42 U.S.C 15002(8) soall individuals with developmental disabilities receive appropriate treatment, services, and habilitation in the least restrictive appropriate setting as provided under section 25-01.2-02.study state and federal laws and regulations relating to the care and treatment of individuals with developmental disabilities. The study must include a review of the following: The state's existing programs to identify potential pathways for individuals who have a developmental disability but do not meet the eligibility criteria for existing programs; Gap identification with programmatic recommendations identifying potential strategies to address the gaps, and potential federal and state funding sources; Efforts and services offered by other states, including the planning and implementation process for any new programs; and

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- d. The impact of implementation and expanding of programs to address service
 gaps, including the number of individuals impacted, cost, and timeline for
 implementation.
 The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together
 - 2. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation necessary to implement those recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative assembly.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$150,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of selecting a consultant to assist legislative management in the study related to the state's developmental services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.
