- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 43-58-08 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the scope of practice of a naturopath.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-58-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 43-58-08. Practice of naturopathic health care. 7 A naturopath may practice naturopathic medicine as a limited practice of the healing 1. 8 arts as exempted under section 43-17-02. A naturopath may not: 9 PrescribeExcept as authorized under subsection 3, prescribe, dispense, or а. 10 administer any prescription drug; 11 Administer ionizing radioactive substances for therapeutic purposes; b. 12 Perform a surgical procedure; or C. 13 d. Claim to practice any licensed health care profession or system of treatment 14 other than naturopathic medicine unless holding a separate license in that 15 profession. A naturopath may not hold out to the public that the naturopath is a 16 primary care provider. 17 A naturopath may prescribe and administer for preventive and therapeutic purposes a 2. 18 prescriptive device and the following nonprescriptive natural therapeutic substances, 19 drugs, and therapies: 20 a. Food, vitamins, minerals, dietary supplements, enzymes, botanical medicines, 21 and homeopathic preparations; 22 Topical drugs, health care counseling, nutritional counseling and dietary therapy, b. 23 naturopathic physical applications, and therapeutic devices; and 24 Barrier devices for contraception. 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1	3.	AWithin the scope of practice, a naturopath:		
2		<u>a.</u>	May prescribe, dispense, administer, and procure drugs and medical devices.	
3		<u>b.</u>	May plan and initiate a therapeutic regimen that includes ordering and	
4			prescribing nonpharmacological interventions, including durable medical	
5			equipment, nutrition, blood and blood products, and diagnostic support services,	
6			including home health care, hospice, and physical and occupational therapy.	
7		<u>C.</u>	May not prescribe or dispense schedule I through V substances as designated by	
8			the federal drug enforcement administration except for testosterone and may	
9			prescribe and dispense all other legend drugs.	
10		<u>d.</u>	May not dispense a drug, unless pharmacy services are not reasonably	
11	1		available, dispensing is in the best interest of the patient, or an emergency exists.	
12		<u>e.</u>	May request, receive, and sign for a professional sample if the naturopath is	
13			authorized to prescribe the sample and may distribute athe professional sample	
14			to a patient.	
15		<u>f.</u>	If prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance, shall register with the federal	
16			drug enforcement administration and shall comply with appropriate state and	
17			federal laws.	
18	<u>4.</u>	A naturopath may perform or order for diagnostic purposes a physical or orificial		
19		examination, ultrasound, phlebotomy, clinical laboratory test or examination,		
20		physiological function test, and any other noninvasive diagnostic procedure commonly		
21		use	ed by physicians in general practice and as authorized by the board.
