- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-24.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the use of an automated clearing house to facilitate payment to
- 3 medical assistance providers and provider applicants; and to amend and reenact sections
- 4 50-24.1-06, 50-24.1-26, and 50-24.1-32 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to remedial
- 5 eye care, Medicaid waivers to provide in-home services, and medical assistance and advanced
- 6 practice registered nurses.

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7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-24.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 50-24.1-06. Remedial eye care When provided.
 - OnWithin the limits of legislative appropriation and on the basis of the findings of an examination made by an ophthalmologist, optometrist, or physician skilled in the diseases of the eye, recommended remedial eye care services must be provided to any individual under the age of sixty-five who is in need of remedial eye care services if the individual is not blind as defined under title XVI of the Social Security Act [42 U.S.C. 1381 et seq.], and the individual is otherwise qualified for assistance under this chapter. Except for services furnished in a medical emergency, the department may not pay for recommended remedial eye care services unless the individual receiving those services first applies for and receives authorization from the department. As used in this section, "remedial eye care services" mean services to prevent blindness or to restore an individual's eyesight, but does not include treatment of diseases causing an impairment or a loss of eyesight, such as diabetes and high blood pressure, ordinary eye examinations, eye glasses, physical examinations, or travel and other expenses necessary to receive treatment.

1	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 50-24.1-26 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	50-24.1-26. Medicaid waivers - In-home services.
4	The department shall administer Medicaid waivers to provide in-home services to children
5	with extraordinary medical needs and to children up to the age of fourteen sixteen diagnosed
6	with an autism spectrum disorder who would otherwise meet institutional level of care. The
7	department may prioritize applicants for the waiver for children with extraordinary medical
8	needs by degree of need.
9	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 50-24.1-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10	amended and reenacted as follows:
11	50-24.1-32. Medical assistance - Services provided by physician assistants and
12	advanced <u>practice</u> registered nurse practitioners nurses.
13	The medical assistance program must recognize physician assistants and advanced
14	practice registered nurse practitioners nurses with the roles of nurse practitioner or certified
15	nurse midwife as primary care providers with the same rights and responsibilities given primary
16	care physicians under the medical assistance program. Any care provided by the physician
17	assistant or advanced <u>practice</u> registered <u>nurse practitioner</u> nurse with the roles of nurse
18	<u>practitioner or certified nurse midwife</u> as a primary care provider under the medical assistance
19	program must be within the scope of the physician assistant's or advanced <u>practice</u> registered
20	nurse practitioner's nurse's respective license.
21	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 50-24.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
22	and enacted as follows:
23	Automated clearing house payments to medical assistance providers and provider
24	applicants.
25	The department shall provide payment to medical assistance providers and may provide
26	payments to provider applicants using an automated clearing house to provide for electronic
27	fund transfers. To receive payment, medical assistance providers and provider applicants shall
28	provide sufficient documentation to enable the department to provide electronic funds transfers
29	through an automated clearing house. No other forms of payment are permitted.
