#### **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1103**

(At the request of the State Department of Health)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 23-10-06.1 and 23-10-06.2 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to mobile home park, recreational vehicle park, and campground license
- 3 renewals and transfers; to amend and reenact sections 23-10-01, 23-10-02, 23-10-02.1,
- 4 23-10-03, 23-10-04, 23-10-06, 23-10-07, 23-10-07.1, 23-10-09, 23-10-10, 23-10-10.1, 23-10-11,
- 5 and 23-10-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to mobile home parks, recreational
- 6 vehicle parks, and campgrounds; and to provide a penalty.

#### 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-10-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 10 **23-10-01**. **Definitions**.

- 11 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- "Campground" means any parcel of land containing three or more lots intended for
   occupancy by travel trailers recreational vehicles or tents.
- 14 2. "Department" means the state department of health.
- 15 3. "Lot" means any piece of land of required size intended for occupancy by a mobile
  16 home, travel trailerrecreational vehicle, or tent.
- 17 4. "Mobile home" means any relocatable <u>manufactured</u>, <u>modular</u>, <u>or prefabricated</u>
- structure or unit whichthat is designed to be used as residential living quarters. The
   term does not include a recreational vehicle.
- 20 5. "Mobile home park" means any parcel of land containing three or more lots intended21 for occupancy by mobile homes.
- "Person" means any individual, firm, trust, partnership, public or private association,
   corporation, or limited liability company.

13		pers	son, organization, or government entity where three or more lots are offered for use	
14		<u>by r</u>	nembers of the public or an organization for rent or lease, including park-owned	
15		<u>recr</u>	eational vehicles held out for rent or lease. A recreational vehicle park is primarily	
16		<u>des</u>	igned to accommodate recreational vehicles.	
17	SEC	TIO	N 2. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
18	amende	d and	d reenacted as follows:	
19	23-1	0-02	. Department to make regulations - Compliance.	
20	The	depa	artment shall have general supervision over the health, safety, sanitary condition,	
21	and lega	l con	npliance as outlined in this chapter of all mobile home parks, trailerrecreational	
22	<u>vehicle</u> p	arks	, and campgrounds in this state and may promulgate and enforce appropriate	
23	rules and	d reg	ulations in accordance with chapter 28-32. All mobile home parks,	
24	trailerred	reati	onal vehicle parks, and campgrounds constructed after July 1, 1977, must be	
25	construc	ted i	n accordance with the requirements of this chapter and the rules and regulations	
26	promulgated at the time of construction. All mobile home parks, trailerrecreational vehicle parks,			
27	and campgrounds constructed before July 1, 1977, shall meet the requirements of this chapter			
28	by July 1, 1985. All mobile home parks, trailer recreational vehicle parks, and campgrounds shall			
29	meet rules and regulations duly promulgated after construction of the park or campground			
30	within ei	ght y	ears after the effective date of the rule or regulation.	

1 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows: 3 23-10-02.1. Department authorized to accept local enforcement and inspection. 4 The department shall accept state, federal, city, or county enforcement of local sanitation, 5 safety, zoning, and inspection requirements in lieu of the enforcement of sanitation, safety, and 6 inspection requirements of the department under this chapter if the department determines that 7 the state, federal, city, or county requirements meet or exceed the requirements of this chapter 8 and any rules and regulations promulgated under this chapter. Prior to Before accepting state. 9 federal, city, or county enforcement of local requirements, the department shall determine that 10 the state, federal, city, or county requirements meet or exceed the requirements of this chapter 11 and any rules and regulations promulgated under this chapter. 12 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows: 14 23-10-03. License required - Application. 15 1. A person may not establish, maintain, change use, mix use, or enlarge a mobile home 16 park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, or campground in this state without first obtaining 17 a license from the department. 18 <u>2.</u> The application for the license must be made in writing to the department and must 19 state the location and type of the mobile home park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, or 20 campground, the proposed water supply, the proposed method of sewerage and 21 garbage disposal, and such other information as may be required by the department. 22 Application forms must be prepared by the department and distributed upon request. 23 <u>3.</u> The department may not issue a license under this section if the proposed mobile 24 home park, recreational vehicle park, or campground would prevent, interfere, or 25 restrict proposed private development that is actively being pursued. 26 The department shall waive the license fee for any mobile home park, <u>4.</u> 27 trailerrecreational vehicle park, or campground owned by the state, a municipality, or a 28 nonprofit organization. The department shall waive all or a portion of the license fee for 29 any mobile home park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, or campground that is subject 30 to local sanitation, safety, and inspection requirements accepted by the department 31 under section 23-10-02.1. A prorated annual license fee may be charged for new

1 mobile home parks, trailerrecreational vehicle parks, and campgrounds. The 2 departmenthealth council may adopt rules establishing the amount and the procedures 3 for the collection of annual license fees. The fees must be based on the cost of 4 reviewing construction plans, conducting routine and complaint inspections, 5 reinspection, and necessary enforcement action. License fees collected pursuant to 6 this section must be deposited in the department's operating fund in the state treasury 7 and any expenditure from the fund is subject to appropriation by the legislative 8 assembly.

9 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

### 11 **23-10-04**. Inspection.

The department shall inspect the premises as soon as practical after receiving an
 application for a mobile home park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, or campground license. If

14 the department is satisfied from the application and inspection that the mobile home park,

15 trailer<u>recreational vehicle</u> park, or campground will not be a source of danger to the health and

16 safety of the occupants or the general public, it the department shall notify the applicant of its

17 approval of the application and of the amount of the license fee. The department shallmust have

18 access to and may inspect mobile home parks, trailerrecreational vehicle parks, and

19 campgrounds at reasonable times. The department shallmay inspect each mobile home park,

20 trailerrecreational vehicle park, and campground at least once every two years in response to a

21 complaint, violation of state law, or on a routine schedule determined by the department.

22 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is

23 amended and reenacted as follows:

# 24 23-10-06. License issuance - TransferabilityFee.

25 <u>An applicant seeking licensure shall apply to the department on forms prescribed by the</u>

26 <u>department. The applicant shall enclose with the application an application fee as determined</u>

27 <u>by rule.</u> The department shall issue a license to the<u>an</u> applicant upon approving the application

28 and receiving the license fee. The license must be upon a form prescribed by the department,

29 must be for a term of one year from January first to December thirty-first, and must be

30 renewable upon the same basis as that upon which it was originally issued. A penalty of-

31 twenty-five percent of the license fee must be imposed if the license is not renewed on or before-

1	January thirty-first following the expiration date. The license must be transferred without charge-				
2	if the proposed new owner applies in writing for a transfer of the license and certifies that the				
3	mobile ł	mobile home park, trailer park, or campground will be operated in accordance with this-			
4	chaptery	chapterwho meets all of the requirements of this chapter and any rules adopted by the health			
5	<u>council</u> .				
6	SEC	SECTION 7. Section 23-10-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted			
7	as follov	as follows:			
8	23-10-06.1. License renewal.				
9	<u>1.</u>	A license issued under this chapter expires on December thirty-first of each year.			
10	<u>2.</u>	A license may be renewed by December thirty-first by submitting a renewal			
11		application, a renewal fee established rule, provided the licensee is in compliance with			
12		this chapter and any rules established by the health council.			
13	<u>3.</u>	If the renewal application and renewal fee are not received by December thirty-first,			
14		the license expires and the licensee may not operate.			
15	<u>4.</u>	Within sixty days after December thirty-first, an expired license may be renewed by			
16		submitting the renewal application, renewal fee, and a late fee. The late fee is equal to			
17		fifty percent of the license fee.			
18	<u>5.</u>	If the renewal application, renewal fee, and late fee are not received within sixty days			
19		after December thirty-first, the department may not renew the license, and the			
20		applicant shall apply and meet the requirements for licensure to be granted a license.			
21	<u>6.</u>	The department may extend the renewal deadline for applications providing proof of			
22		hardship rendering the applicant unable to meet the deadline.			
23	<u>7.</u>	The department may not renew a license if the mobile home park, recreational vehicle			
24		park, or campground is not actively conducting business at the site, and the applicant			
25		shall apply and meet the requirements for licensure to be granted a license.			
26	SEC	CTION 8. Section 23-10-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted			
27	as follow	VS:			
28	23-10-06.2. License transferability.				
29	The department shall transfer a license without charge if the proposed new owner applies in				
30	writing for a transfer of the license and certifies that the mobile home park, recreational vehicle				
31	park, or campground will be operated in accordance with this chapter.				

1	SEC	CTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
2	amended and reenacted as follows:			
3	23-10-07. Sanitation and safety.			
4	Eve	Every mobile home park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, and campground must be		
5	operated with strict regard for the health, safety, and comfort of its occupants. The following			
6	sanitary	and safety regulations must be followed:		
7	1.	Location: Every mobile home park must be established and maintained upon dry,		
8		well-drained ground. Any natural sinkholes or collection or pool of water must be		
9		artificially drained and filled. Trailer Recreational vehicle park and campground lots		
10		must be established and maintained upon dry, well-drained spaces.		
11	2.	Drinking water supply: An adequate supply of potable and safe drinking water must be		
12		provided. Water from other than a municipal supply may not be used until inspected,		
13		tested, and certified by the departmentThe operator of a mobile home park,		
14		recreational vehicle park, or campground shall supply drinking water at the mobile		
15		home park, recreational vehicle park, or campground which is obtained from an		
16		approved source that is a public water system or a nonpublic water system that is		
17		constructed, maintained, and operated according to law.		
18	3.	Towels: The placing of roller cloth towels for public use in any washroom or place		
19		within a mobile home park, trailer <u>recreational vehicle</u> park, or campground is		
20		prohibited. Individual cloth towels, cloth towels provided in mechanical dispensers,		
21		individual paper towels, or roller paper towels must be placed for use.		
22	4.	Toilets: Modern sanitary flush toilets must be provided where a sewer connection is		
23		available. If a sewer connection is not available, sanitary flyproof privies must be		
24		maintained. All toilets and privies must be kept in a clean, sanitary condition. Separate		
25		toilets and privies must be provided for each sex. No privy or cesspool may be located		
26		less than one hundred feet [30.48 meters] from any well, kitchen, or sleeping quarters.		
27	5.	Garbage: All garbage and refuse must be stored in metal flyproofdurable, cleanable,		
28		insect- and rodent-resistant containers, and the contents removed and disposed of on-		
29		a regular basisat a frequency that will minimize the development of objectionable		
30		odors and other conditions that attract or harbor insects and rodents. All buildings		

1		within the mobile home park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, or campground must be
2		screened against flies and kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
3	6.	Plumbing installations: All plumbing installations in a mobile home park,
4		trailerrecreational vehicle park, or campground must be made in accordance with the
5		state plumbing code and state laws.
6	7.	Electrical installations: All electrical installations in a mobile home park,
7		trailerrecreational vehicle park, or campground must be made in accordance with the
8		state electrical code.
9	8.	Streets and roadways: Each mobile home park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, and
10		campground shall <u>must</u> have roadways or streets wide enough to facilitate the
11		movement of traffic within the park or campground.
12	9.	Lighting: Each mobile home park must be well-lighted, recreational vehicle park, and
13		campground must have adequate lighting as set forth in rule.
14	10.	Fire protection: Each mobile home park shall, recreational vehicle park, and
15		campground must have adequate fire protection in accordance with the state fire code.
16	11.	Playgrounds: Each mobile home park containing twenty-five or more lots shall provide
17		playground space equivalent to one lot for every twenty-five lots in the park.
18	12.	Multiple-story parks: A multiple-story mobile home park or trailer park may not be
19		constructed in this state.
20	SEC	TION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
21	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
22	23-1	0-07.1. Service fees.
23	Serv	vice fees that reasonably reflect the cost of the service provided in a mobile home park,
24	trailerrecreational vehicle park, or campground may be charged. Fees may not be charged	
25	unless a service is actually provided.	
26	SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
27	amended and reenacted as follows:	
28	23-1	0-09. Occupancy record.
29	The	owner or manager of a mobile home park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, or
30	campground shall maintain a current record of the names of the occupants of the park or	
31	campgro	bund.

1	SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	23-10-10. Posting rules and regulations.
4	The owner or manager of a licensed mobile home park, recreational vehicle park, or
5	campground conspicuously shall post or distribute a digital or hard copy of this chapter and the
6	relevant rules and regulations to each tenant in the park. The owner or manager of a trailer park-
7	or campground shall conspicuously post a copy of this chapter and the relevant rules and
8	regulations in the trailer park or campground. Material required to be distributed or posted under
9	this section must be provided by the department free of charge.
10	SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-10.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11	amended and reenacted as follows:
12	23-10-10.1. Requirement of <u>emergency</u> response procedures in certain mobile home
13	<del>parks</del> .
14	The owner of a mobile home park that contains at least ten mobile homes, recreational
15	vehicle park, or campground shall establish a procedure for responding to emergencies and
16	complaints by tenants with respect to the mobile home park. The procedure must include the
17	ability to reach a person who has the authority to perform, or direct the performance of, duties
18	imposed on the owner under this chapter. The procedure must be posted conspicuously in the
19	mobile home park, recreational vehicle park, and campground or a copy must be provided to
20	the tenants in writing and a copy must be provided to the tenants.
21	SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
22	amended and reenacted as follows:
23	23-10-11. Ejection from premises.
24	The owner or manager of a mobile home park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, or
25	campground may eject any person from the premises for nonpayment of charges or fees for
26	accommodations, for a violation of law, for disorderly conduct, for a violation of any regulation of
27	the department, or for a violation of any reasonable rule of the mobile home park,
28	trailerrecreational vehicle park, or campground which is publicly posted within the park or
29	campground.
30	SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 23-10-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
31	amended and reenacted as follows:

## 1 23-10-12. Revocation of license - Penalty for operating without license.

2 The department may revoke any license issued under this chapterdeny an application or

3 take disciplinary action, up to and including revocation, against any applicant or licensee upon

- 4 the failure of the <u>applicant or</u> licensee to comply with this chapter or with any of the rules
- 5 adopted by the health council and regulations promulgated by the department. Before any-
- 6 license may be revoked, the department takes disciplinary action against a license, the
- 7 department shall notify the licensee in writing of the reason revocation disciplinary action is
- 8 being considered and shall provide a reasonable amount of time for correction to be made.
- 9 Action taken under the authority granted in this section must comply with chapter 28-32. Any
- 10 person who maintains or operates a mobile home park, trailerrecreational vehicle park, or
- 11 campground without first obtaining a license, or who operates the same after revocation of the
- 12 license, is guilty of an infraction.
