1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 1-03, a new section to chapter

- 2 50-06, and section 50-11-01.7 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to training and
- 3 screening for fetal alcohol spectrum disorder, creating a cross-disability advisory council, and

4 establishing an annual day of awareness for fetal alcohol spectrum disorder; and to amend and

5 reenact subsection 3 of section 25-01.2-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fetal

6 alcohol spectrum disorder.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

9 and enacted as follows:

10 Fetal alcohol spectrum disorder awareness day.

11 <u>To celebrate the life of all affected by fetal alcohol spectrum disorder, reaffirm the dignity</u>

12 and value of every human being, and to create awareness of the number of people affected by

13 the disorder, the ninth day of September of each year is designated and established as fetal

14 alcohol spectrum disorder awareness day for the state of North Dakota.

15 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 25-01.2-01 of the North Dakota

16 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

17 3. "Developmental disability" means a severe, chronic disability of an individual which:

- 18 a. Is attributable to a mental or physical impairment or combination of mental and
- 19 physical impairments, including Down syndrome and fetal alcohol spectrum
- 20 disorders, including fetal alcohol syndrome, partial fetal alcohol syndrome, and
- 21 <u>alcohol-related neurodevelopmental disorder;</u>
- b. Is manifested before the individual attains age twenty-two;
- 23 c. Is likely to continue indefinitely;

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1		d. Results in substantial functional limitations in three or more of the following areas			
2		of	major life activity:		
3		(1) Self-care;		
4		(2) Receptive and expressive language;		
5		(3) Learning;		
6		(4) Mobility;		
7		(5) Self-direction;		
8		(6) Capacity for independent living; and		
9		(7) Economic sufficiency; and		
10		e. R	eflects the individual's needs for a combination and sequence of special,		
11		in	terdisciplinary, or generic care, treatment, or other services which are of lifelong		
12		or	extended duration and are individually planned and coordinated.		
13	SEC	TION 3	. A new section to chapter 50-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
14	and enacted as follows:				
15	Cross-disability advisory council - Appointment - Duties.				
16	<u>1.</u>	The cro	oss-disability advisory council shall participate with and provide feedback to the		
17		<u>departr</u>	ment regarding the implementation, planning, and design of the cross-disability		
18		<u>childre</u>	n's waiver and level of care reform for the comprehensive developmental		
19		<u>disabili</u>	ties Medicaid home and community-based waiver.		
20	<u>2.</u>	<u>The de</u>	partment shall contract with a qualified, independent third party to facilitate and		
21		provide	e support services to the council. The contracted facilitator shall appoint the		
22		cross-c	lisability advisory council members in accordance with subsection 3 and		
23		<u>establi</u>	sh the length of members terms and the structure of the cross-disability		
24		<u>adviso</u>	ry council. A representative from the contracted facilitator shall serve as the		
25		presidi	ng officer of the advisory council.		
26	<u>3.</u>	The cro	oss-disability advisory council consists of up to fifteen voting members. A		
27		<u>majorit</u>	y of the members of the council must be family members of individuals with a		
28		<u>disabili</u>	ty, or must be individuals with a disability, who receive Medicaid home and		
29		<u>comm</u>	unity-based services. The remaining members of the council must be appointed		
30		based	on their professional subject matter expertise in or knowledge of the needs and		
31		interes	ts of individuals with disabilities. The council's membership must represent		

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1		<u>diff</u>	erent regions of the state and a broad range of disabilities that pertain to the			
2		Medicaid home and community-based services. Upon request of the department, state				
3		agency representatives shall participate with the cross-disability advisory council in a				
4		nonvoting role.				
5	<u>4.</u>	The cross-disability advisory council shall meet at least quarterly and may appoint				
6		subcommittees to address specific topics or disabilities, which may include autism,				
7		traumatic brain injury, and fetal alcohol spectrum disorder. A majority of the voting				
8		members of the council constitutes a quorum.				
9	<u>5.</u>	<u>The</u>	e cross-disability advisory council shall:			
10		<u>a.</u>	Discuss strategies to address gaps or needs regarding individuals with			
11			disabilities and Medicaid home and community-based services;			
12		<u>b.</u>	Provide for the active participation of stakeholders, including consumers and			
13			providers; and			
14		<u>C.</u>	Receive information from the department and its consultants.			
15	<u>6.</u>	<u>The</u>	e cross-disability advisory council members, excluding the contracted facilitator, are			
16		<u>enti</u>	itled to reimbursement from the department for travel and lodging at the same rate			
17		<u>as</u>	provided for state officers and employees.			
18	SEC	SECTION 4. Section 50-11-01.7 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted				
19	as follows:					
20	50-11-01.7. Fetal alcohol spectrum disorder training.					
21	The department shall integrate fetal alcohol spectrum disorder instruction into the training					
22	programs for public and private child welfare providers and foster parents, and further shall					
23	integrate a formal fetal alcohol spectrum disorder screening into the early and periodic					
24	<u>screenir</u>	screening diagnostic and treatment services. The course may be provided electronically.
