- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 19-24.1-05, 19-24.1-18, and 19-24.1-19 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to reapplication for registered identification cards for
- 3 marijuana.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 7 19-24.1-05. Qualifying patients and designated caregivers Identification cards 8 Issuance and denial.
- Upon receipt of a complete application for or renewal of a qualifying patient or
   designated caregiver registry identification card, the department shall verify the
- submitted information.
   The verification methods used by the department
- 12 2. The verification methods used by the department on an application or renewal and13 accompanying documentation may include:
- a. Contacting an applicant by telephone or mail, or if proof of identity is uncertain,
  the department shall require a face-to-face meeting and the production of
  additional identification materials;
- b. Contacting the North Dakota board of medicine or North Dakota board of nursing
  to verify the certifying health care provider is licensed in the state and is in good
  standing; and
- c. Contacting the health care provider to obtain additional documentation verifying
   the qualifying patient applicant's medical diagnosis and medical condition qualify
   the applicant for participation in the medical marijuana program.
- 23 3. Upon verification of the information contained in an application or renewal, the
  24 department shall approve or deny the application or renewal.

4		registry identification card if the designated caregiver applicant:		
5		a.	Does not meet the requirements of this section or section 19-24.1-04;	
6		b.	Did not provide the required information and materials; or	
7		C.	Previously had a registry identification card revoked which involved unauthorized	
8			minor transfer, use, or access to usable marijuana or the use of usable marijuana	
9			which allowed the smoke or vapor to be inhaled by a minor; or	
10		d.	Provided false or falsified information or made a material misstatement; or	
11		e.	Previously had a registry identification card revoked three times.	
12	9.	<u>An</u>	individual may not reapply forNotwithstanding subsection 8, the department shall	
13		<u>den</u>	y an application for or renewal of a qualifying patient or designated caregiver	
14		<u>reg</u> i	istry identification card for one year from the date of an initial revocation and five	
15		<u>yea</u>	rs from the date of a second revocation. Upon a third revocation, the cardholder is	
16		<u>disc</u>	qualified from further participation under this chapter.

29	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
30	amended and reenacted as follows:			

1	19-2	24.1-	18. Compassion centers - Agents - Registry identification cards.
2	1.	Upo	on issuance of a compassion center registry certificate, the department shall issue
3		a re	egistry identification card to each qualified compassion center agent associated with
4		the	compassion center.
5	2.	To	qualify to be issued a registry identification card, each compassion center agent
6		mu	st be at least twenty-one years of age and shall submit all of the following registry
7		ideı	ntification card application material to the department:
8		a.	A photographic copy of the agent's department-approved identification. The agent
9			shall make the identification available for inspection and verification by the
10			department.
11		b.	A recent two-by-two inch [5.08-by-5.08 centimeter] photograph of the agent.
12		c.	A written and signed statement from an officer or executive staff member of the
13			compassion center stating the applicant is associated with the compassion center
14			and the capacity of the association.
15		d.	The name, address, and telephone number of the agent.
16		e.	The name, address, and telephone number of the compassion center with which
17			the agent is associated.
18		f.	The agent's signature and the date.
19		g.	A nonrefundable application or renewal fee in the amount of two hundred dollars.
20	3.	Ead	ch compassion center agent shall consent to a criminal history record check
21		con	ducted under section 12-60-24 to demonstrate compliance with the eligibility
22		req	uirements.
23		a.	All applicable fees associated with the required criminal history record checks
24			must be paid by the compassion center or the agent.
25		b.	A criminal history record check must be performed upon initial application and
26			biennially upon renewal. A compassion center agent shall consent to a criminal
27			history record check at any time the department determines necessary.
28		C.	An individual convicted of a drug-related misdemeanor offense within the
29			five-year period before the date of application or a felony offense is prohibited
30			from being a compassion center agent.

1	4.	The department shall notify the compassion center in writing of the purpose for
2		denying a compassion center agent application for a registry identification card. The
3		department shall deny an application if the applicant fails to meet the registration
4		requirements or to provide the information required, if the applicant previously had a
5		registry identification card revoked subject to sections 19-24.1-05, 19-24.1-19, and
6		<u>19-24.1-20</u> , or if the department determines the information provided is false. The
7		cardholder may appeal a denial or revocation of a registry identification card to the
8		district court of Burleigh County for hearing. The court may authorize the cardholder to
9		appear by reliable electronic means.
10	5.	The department shall issue a compassion center agent a registry identification card
11		within thirty calendar days of approval of an application.
12	6.	A compassion center agent with a registry identification card shall notify the
13		department of any of the following within ten calendar days of the change, in a manner
14		prescribed by the department:
15		a. A change in the cardholder's name or address; and
16		b. Knowledge of a change that would render the compassion center agent no longer
17		eligible to be a cardholder.
18	7.	If a compassion center agent loses the agent's registry identification card, that agent
19		shall notify the department in writing within twenty-four hours of becoming aware the
20		card has been lost.
21	8.	If a cardholder notifies the department of items listed in this section but the nature of
22		the item reported results in the cardholder remaining eligible, the department shall
23		issue the cardholder a new registry identification card with a new random ten-digit
24		alphanumeric identification number within twenty calendar days of approving the
25		updated information and the cardholder shall pay a fee, not to exceed twenty-five
26		dollars. If a cardholder notifies the department of an item that results in the cardholder
27		being ineligible, the registry identification card immediately becomes void.
28	9.	A compassion center shall notify the department in writing within two calendar days of
29		the date a compassion center agent ceases to work for or be associated with the
30		compassion center. Upon receipt of the notification, that individual's registry
31		identification card becomes void immediately.

1	10.	The registry identification card of a compassion center agent expires one year after
2		issuance or upon the termination of the compassion center's registration certificate,
3		whichever occurs first. To prevent interruption of possession of a valid registry
4		identification card, a compassion center agent shall renew a registry identification card
5		by submitting a complete renewal application no less than forty-five calendar days
6		before the expiration date of the existing registry identification card.
7	SEC	TION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is
8	amendeo	and reenacted as follows:
9	19-2	4.1-19. Cardholders - Compassion centers - Revocation.
10	1.	The department may suspend or revoke a cardholder's registry identification card or a
11		compassion center's registration certificate for a material misstatement by an applicant
12		in an application or renewal.
13	2.	The department may suspend or revoke a registry identification card or registration
14		certificate for a violation of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter.
15	3.	If a compassion center agent or a compassion center sells or otherwise transfers
16		marijuana or usable marijuana to a person not authorized to possess marijuana or
17		usable marijuana under this chapter, the department shall revoke the cardholder's
18		registry identification card or the compassion center's registration certificate, or both. If
19		the department revokes a cardholder's registry identification card under this
20		subsection, the cardholder may not reapply for one year from the date of an initial
21		revocation and five years from the date of a second revocation. Upon a third
22		revocation or if the revocation under this subsection involved unauthorized minor
23		transfer, use, or access to usable marijuana or the use of usable marijuana which
24		allowed the smoke or vapor to be inhaled by a minor, the cardholder is disqualified
25		from further participation under this chapter.
26	4.	The department shall provide written notice of suspension or revocation of a registry
27		identification card or registration certificate.
28		a. A suspension may not be for a period longer than six months.
29		b. A manufacturing facility may continue to produce and process and to possess
30		marijuana and usable marijuana during a suspension, but may not transfer or sell
31		usable marijuana.

1	C.	A dispensary may continue to possess usable marijuana during a suspension,
2		but may not purchase, dispense, or transfer usable marijuana.
3	d.	The cardholder or the compassion center may appeal a denial or revocation of a
4		registry identification card or registry certificate to the district court of Burleigh
5		County for hearing. The court may authorize the cardholder or compassion center
6		to appear by reliable electronic means.
