2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 3 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-21.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 **4-21.1-01**<u>4.1-22-01</u>. Definitions.

- 6 In this chapter, except when the context or subject matteras otherwise requires provided:
- 7 1. "Certificate of inspection" means a document issued or authorized by the
- 8 commissioner stating that nursery stock is practically free from damaging pests.
- 9 2. "Commissioner" means the agriculture commissioner or the commissioner's
 authorized representativedesignee.
- "Grower" means any person who takes a reproductive part of nursery stock and
 increases itsthe size and development of the stock for at least one full growing
- 13 season. <u>ThisA grower</u> includes a person producing nursery stock from tissue culture.
- 14 4. "Infested" means actually infested or infected with a pestquantity of pests or so
- 15 exposed to infestationa quantity of pests that it would be reasonable to believe that an-
- 16 infestation potential for harm or threat to the health of the host nursery stock exists.

- 17 5. "Nonhardy" means plant species, varieties, and cultivars that will not survive climatic
 18 conditions in North Dakota.
- 19 6. "Nursery" means any place where nursery stock is propagated, grown, or offered for20 sale.
- 7. "Nursery stock" means all trees, shrubs, and woody vines and <u>their</u> parts thereof which are capable of propagation or growth, except seed. Only those plants that are intended for outdoor planting are considered nursery stock.

1	8.	"Person" means any individual, corporation, limited liability company, company,
2		society, association, government agency, or other entity.
	NOTE: "Person" is defined in North Dakota Century Code Section 1-01-49(8) for purpose of the entire Century Code to have essentially the same meaning. The definition is not needed here.	
3	9.	"Pest" means any invertebrate animal, pathogen, parasitic plant, or other similar
4		organism which can cause damage to nursery stock.
5	10.<u>9.</u>	"Place of business" means each separate location from which nursery stock is being
6		offered for sale.
7	11.<u>10.</u>	"Viable nursery stock" means nursery stock that is capable of living and accomplishing
8		the purpose for which it is grown, whether for foliage, flowers, fruit, or special use.
9	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
10	amended and reenacted as follows:	
11	4-21.1-024.1-22-02. Administration - Rulemaking authority.	
12	The commissioner has the responsibility for administration of the provisions of shall	
13	<u>administer</u> this chapter. The commissioner may adopt such rules pursuant to <u>under</u> chapter	
14	28-32 as are necessary to carry out the purposes and provisions of implement this chapter.	
15	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
16	amended and reenacted as follows:	
17	4-21.1-03 <u>4.1-22-03</u> . Authority for inspection.	
18	The commissioner shall inspect all nursery stock being grown in North Dakota at least once	
19	each year and may enter and inspect any nursery or place of business during normal business	
20	hours.	
21	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
22	amended and reenacted as follows:	
23	4-21.1-044.1-22-04. Authority for abatement - Removal from sale.	
24	The	commissioner may, upon<u>After</u> giving notice to the owner or the owner's agent, <u>the</u>
25	commissioner may destroy, treat, or remove from sale, at the owner's expense, any nursery	
26	stock offered for sale that is found to be not viable, not accompanied by a certificate of	
27	inspection, not labeled correctly, or infested with a pest.	
28	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
29	amended and reenacted as follows:	

1 4-21.1-054.1-22-05. Certification of nursery stock.

2 AThe commissioner shall issue a certificate of inspection may be issued annually by the 3 commissioner for nursery stock grown in licensed nurseries within North Dakota that is the state 4 found to be practically free from damaging pests. Certificates expire on December thirty-first 5 each year unless canceled at an earlier date. Certification may be withheld by the commissioner 6 when nursery stock is infested with a pest or if weeds or other objects prevent the 7 commissioner from making an adequate inspection of the nursery stock. All nursery stock being 8 offered for sale within North Dakotathe state must be from officially inspected sources. A copy of 9 a certificate of inspection from the state of origin must accompany each commercial lot or 10 shipment of nursery stock that is transported into or offered for sale within North Dakota. All

reproductions<u>copies</u> of the North Dakota certificate of inspection <u>needed</u>required for shipping
 purposes must be approved by the commissioner.

13 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is

14 amended and reenacted as follows:

15 **4-21.1-064.1-22-06**. Nursery license - Fee.

16 No<u>A</u> person may <u>not</u> sell nursery stock without a license issued by the commissioner.

17 Licenses expire on December thirty-first each year unless revoked at an earlier date. An

18 application for renewal of license with any <u>additional</u> information requested required by the

19 commissioner must be submitted and accompanied by a fee of fifty dollars on or before

20 December thirty-first each year. A separate license is required for each place of business. TheA

21 fee of ten dollars must be submitted for each additional license, other than the principal place of

business, is ten dollars. <u>NoA</u> license may <u>not</u> be issued to a grower unless the grower has <u>first</u>.

24 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is

25 amended and reenacted as follows:

26 **4-21.1-11**<u>4.1-22-07</u>. Labeling and standards for nursery stock.

27 NoA person may not sell or offer for sale any nursery stock not labeled in accordance with

28 the international code of nomenclature for cultivated plants with the complete correct botanical

29 or approved recognized common name. All nonhardy trees and shrubs, as

30 designated<u>determined</u> by the commissioner, must be labeled with the statement "nonhardy in

31 North Dakota". All nursery stock offered for sale or distribution must be in a viable condition and

- 1 must be stored and displayed under conditions that will maintain its viability. Materials used to
- 2 coat the aerial parts of the plant that which change the appearance of the plant surface so as to
- 3 prevent adequate inspection are prohibited.
- 4 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 4-21.1-124.1-22-08. Misrepresentation.
- 7 It is unlawful for any person to <u>A person may not</u> misrepresent the name, age, origin, grade,
- 8 variety, quality, or hardiness of any nursery stock being offered for sale.
- 9 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11 **4-21.1-13**<u>4.1-22-09</u>. Reciprocal agreements.

- 12 The commissioner may enter into reciprocal agreements with officers of other states for the
- 13 recognition of official licenses and inspection certificates.
- 14 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 15 amended and reenacted as follows:

16 **4-21.1-14**<u>4.1-22-10</u>. Exemptions.

- 17 The commissioner may exempt certain nursery stock, nurseries, or persons from all or part
- 18 of the sections provisions of this chapter. Exemptions from licenses and fees may include:
- Persons growing and propagating nursery stock for research or experimental
 purposes-;
- Soil conservation districts selling nursery stock for the prevention of soil and wind
 erosion or other conservation plantings-; and
- 23 3. Persons growing nursery stock for noncommercial purposes or that the commissioner
 24 designates as exempt.

25 SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 4-21.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is

26 amended and reenacted as follows:

27 **4-21.1-16**<u>4.1-22-11</u>. Penalties - Criminal - Civil - License revocation or nonrenewal.

- Anylt is a class B misdemeanor for any person who violates to violate this chapter, or
 any rules adopted pursuant to it, is guilty of a class B misdemeanor under this chapter.
- 30 2. Any person who violates any of the provisions provision of this chapter, or rules rule
- 31 adopted pursuant to it<u>under this chapter</u>, is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed five

- hundred dollars for each violation. The civil penalty may be adjudicated by the courts
 or by the commissioner through an administrative hearing pursuant tounder chapter
 28-32.
- The department may <u>maintain</u>, in accordance with the laws of this state, maintain an
 appropriate civil action in the name of the state against any person violating this
 chapter or rules adopted under this chapter.
- 7 4. The commissioner may refuse to grant a license to any person found guilty of
 8 repeated violations of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter, or to any
 9 person who has failed to pay an adjudicated civil penalty for violation of this chapter
 10 within thirty days after a final determination that the civil penalty is owed.
