TESTIMONY HOUSE BILL NO. 1287 HOUSE GOVT/VETS AFFAIRS JANUARY 21, 1999

Chairman Klein and members of the House Governmental and Veterans Affairs Committee. My name is Wanda Gier, Program Administrator, Vocational Rehabilitation, North Dakota Department of Human Services. I appear before you today in opposition of the proposed House Bill 1287.

The Office of Vocational Rehabilitation has been the agency responsible for the implementation of the Equipment Distribution Program in North Dakota since 1993. Since then, we have worked with entities to distribute equipment for deaf, hearing impaired and speech impaired in relation to use of the telephone system. It is extremely important that this process have input from the people that are served. There are presently 3 advisory councils in place to provide advice and information. All three councils are federally mandated and consist of at least 51% persons with disabilities. All 3 councils are required to have multi-disability representation. The 3 councils are: Rehabilitation Services Advisory Council, State Independent Living Council and the Boards of Independent Living Centers. At this time, it is our contention that there are systems already in place which serve in an advisory role to Vocational Rehabilitation on matters concerning the Telecommunications Equipment Distribution Program and allocating the resources available to the program.

TESTIMONY ON HB1287 To the House Government and Veterans Affairs Committee By the Information Services Division Thursday, January 21, 1999

In July 1993 the Information Services Division (ISD) started providing a telecommunications relay service to the communications impaired community in accordance with Section IV of the Americans with Disability Act. ISD entered into a contract with Sprint to provide the service and pays for the cost of the service by assessing a surcharge to each telephone access line, radio and cellular service. The surcharge is .04 per access line, radio and cellular service. We pay .79 per minute for all calls placed through the relay service provider. Since we started the service, ISD has received two complaints about the service and the vendor has corrected them immediately. We also, at the request of individuals from the communications impaired community using the service, have enhanced the service by adding new features. We do not have any outstanding complaints or requests for additional features to the service today. We do not believe that an Advisory Council will improve the relay service but only add administrative costs.
