

Minutes: Chairman Krebsbach called the Senate Government and Veteran's Affairs committee to order. The clerk called the roll. At this time CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH opened the hearing on SB 2140 which relates to the higher education system review and the time of the report to the legislative assembly. This bill is similar in content to SB 2056 which was heard at an earlier date. Appearing before the committee was LAURA GLATT, Vice Chancellor for Administrative Affairs for the NDUS. A copy of her brief written testimony is attached. She indicated at the close of her testimony that this bill is indeed similar in content to proposed SB 2056. There was no further testimony in support of the bill, no one appeared in neutral position on the bill, and no one appeared in opposition to the bill. Ms. Glatt indicated to the committee that the NDUS would not be in opposition to a combination of these bills or whatever the committee felt was best. The hearing was closed on SB 2140. Members of the committee briefly discussed the contents of SB 2140 (Tape 1, Side A, 1/21/99, Meter #'s 273-678). It was

their discussion that SB 2056 included the same information, however, it was noted that it did a little more than SB 2140 and would be the better of the two bills to use. Following discussion a motion for DO NOT PASS on SB2140 was made by SENATOR STENEHJEM, seconded by SENATOR DEMERS. ROLL CALL VOTE (Tape 1, Side A, 1/21/99, Meter #'s 678-900) indicated 7 YEAS, 0 NAYS, and 0 ABSENT OR NOT VOTING. SENATOR MUTZENBERGER volunteered to carry the bill.

1999 TESTIMONY

SB 2140

Chair and Members of the Committee:

I am Laura Glatt, Vice Chancellor for Administrative Affairs for the NDUS. I am here today to support SB2140. This piece of legislation merely updates dates for Board planning and reporting purposes. It would require the Board of Higher Education to report to the Legislative Council and Governor in 2002 on the status of the current goals as outlined in the Board's strategic plan for the period 1998-2004.

In 2003, the Board would be required to present a new comprehensive strategic plan for the period 2004-2010. Every year thereafter, the Board would report to the Governor and Legislature on the status of the implementation of the goals outlined in the plan.

It also eliminates the requirement that these meetings specifically occur in October. This provides the Legislative Council and the Governor the flexibility to determine the most appropriate time to meet.

You should also be aware that the Board introduced a bill that to amend NDCC 15-10-14.2. The bill number is 2056. It accomplishes many of the same changes outlined here.
