Mr. WAGNER stated that most are unanimous; there is not much distention.

Testimony on SB 2266
Senate Human Services Committee
January 27, 1999

Chairman Thane and members of the Human Services Committee, for the record I am Senator Rod St. Aubyn, from District 43 in Grand Forks. Senate Bill 2266 is a bill which looks like a lot more changes than actually exist. What it does is replaces one member of the Committee on Protection and Advocacy with a new member. Originally, the statute called for a member from the Mental Health Consumer Advocates of North Dakota. Unfortunately, this group disbanded and our committee was unable to fill the vacancy. To replace this member, this bill proposes that a member be appointed by the governing board of the mental health association. Based on federal law, the committee members themselves can not be service providers. Based on Legislative Council's style, the language in the old section has been revised and some federal requirements added and that is the only difference between current law and this proposed legislation.

I ask for your support in giving SB 2266 a Do Pass recommendation. Mr. Chairman, I would be willing to answer any questions your committee may have. Thank you.
