Minutes: Chr DeKrey opened the hearing on HB 1027.

John Walstad: Legislative Council, Code Revisor - Council for the Administrative Rules Committee. HB 1027 - Relating to agency procedures to notify interested parties of when rules adopted by the agency will be considered by the administrative rules committee and to provide an effect date. This bill adds a sentence to existing law, saying that the agency has to adopt a procedure to allow those interested parties to request and receive notice from the agency of the date and place the rule will be reviewed by the administrative rules committee.

Rep Delmore: Will this bill limit who will be notified?

John Walstad: Won't limit who is notified, under existing law no- one receives direct notification. The Rules Committee does put out notice in advance of their hearing.

Rep Mahoney: Couldn't the agency do this under current law?

John Walstad: That is correct, the concern of the committee is that agencies are not doing that. Agencies lose track of what is going on.

Minutes: **Senator Traynor**, opened the hearing on HB 1027.

John Walstead, attorney for the Legislative Council, right now agencies are required to publish rulemaking hearings. Objective is to make info available to the public. After the hearing it must remain open another 30 days for opinions after which it may then be adopted. Bill adds that agencies must give information when they meet. The idea is to make meeting awareness for the public. Why 1030 is referenced? It is big and it doesn't do anything. It rearranges administrative rules, which legislative body has done. Idea was to rewrite the chapter. Problem was, there are 700 laws that reference chapter 32. Tried not to change one word so nothing sneaky is going on. A big house keeping bill. Nothing much is changed.

Senator Watne, on page 2 28-32-11 is referenced to the new law proposed in 1030. If 1030 doesn't pass, it will then need to be changed.
