1A: 326 CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: Chairman Nicholas opened on HB 1257.

REPRESENTATIVE FROELICH: Mr. Chairman if I may. This has been a contention in North Dakota for years that one quarter of land is not farmer, rancher friendly. One quarter is kind of a hobby farm. The law was intended for farmers and ranchers to get a gratis tag. I was not going to submit a Bill to the House of Representatives this year because. I'd like to delete the 160 acres and make it 640 acres.

1A:441 CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: My question committee members is do we want to do something with this Bill. The gratis is really for immediate family that is living out there farming. We could change state law if we want but I just think that twenty dollars won't buy a round of drinks in most bars.

1A: REPRESENTATIVE FROELICH: Mr. Chairman, I would not pass this law as it is. I am not in favor of it. If its OK with the committee I will offer an amendment to the 640 acres.



1A:00 CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: We will now open the meeting on HB 1257

1A: REPRESENTATIVE DELZER: Mr. chairman and members of the committee. My name is Jeff Delzer. I am a Representative from District Eight. Prepared text was presented and is attached to these minutes.

1A: REPRESENTATIVE BERG: Would siblings not living with them be able to count. Would out of state siblings be able to hunt.

1A: REPRESENTATIVE DELZER: Mr. Chairman and Representative Berg. I'm not sure legally if that would work or not but the Section starts with a resident yaw know, I would prefer that that it be residence.

1A:182 CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: Any other questions Committee Members. Thank you Representative Delzer. I don't see any other Legislators that are sponsors on the Bill. I will

take testimony from whoever else would like to give testimony on HB 1257. Anyone here to oppose HB1257.

1A:273 Roger Executive Director of the North Dakota Game and Fish Department:

CC: The above line. I'm not certain of Roger's title. Could not understand him.

HB1257 virtually no one disagrees a gratis license for farmers, ranchers and land owners are providing Deer habitat. Prepared text attached. Attached to these minutes.

Following his prepared testimony, Roger requested a DO NOT PASS, and asked for questions.

1A:438 CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: Clarify once for me. The century says immediate family and we are doing an overstrike and adding an immediate family member.

1A:ROGER: It says immediate family members customarily residing. That narrows it down to immediate family members living on the farm.

1A:668: REPRESENTATIVE WRANGHAM: If a rancher has the title to several sections of land can he divide that up and get more than one gratis permit? Or is this one per land owner.

1A:ROGER: It all depends on if he has a son coming into the business so to speak that's he's coming on, they would both qualify. If he is just a sole proprietor he can transfer that to his kids I think the thought behind this is that the guy's are already getting gratis for farmers and ranchers.

When you get into the 160 acres the gratis permits would dramatically increase.

1A:770 REPRESENTATIVE BERG: The gratis really dose two things. Number one, it guarantees that you get a license. Number two you don't have to pay a fee for that.

It has to be used on land that is owned or leased?

Just so I am clear on this? When you first receive the gratis license, they can hunt anywhere in that unit or do they have to hunt on the land where they received the gratis tag?

1A:ROGER: The qualifying land for the gratis only.

1A: REPRESENTATIVE FROELICH: Is there anyway you can probably come up with data. How many people are applying for a gratis license that own 160 acres?

1A:ROGER: We can do a sampling of it. I could take a random sample of the numbers just to give you some kind of an idea.

1A:960 CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: Anyone else. O.K. Anyone else wishing to appear in opposition to this BILL?

1A:978 MIKE DONAHUE: I'm here to represent the NORTH DAKOTA WILD LIFE ASSOCIATION. We are apposed to the Bill for a lot of the reasons stated by the Game and Fish Department. This would affect the first lottery.

1A:REPRESENTATIVE LEMIEUX: If we increased the acreage. What would your thought be on that.

1A:MIKE DONAHUE: I think if it went from 160 acres to 640 my personal opinion is I think we should do that. It would have to be in the same unit.

I do think that increasing the acreage would help.

It is estimated that at least 3,000 additional gratis licenses will be issued if this law is implemented. These are licenses that would be sold under the current law. The reduction of revenue for the Game and Fish Department would be about \$60,000 per year or \$120,000 per biennium.

2001 TESTIMONY

HB 1257

Mr. Chairman and members of the committee,

For the record my name is Jeff Delzer, Representative from dist 8, which consists of parts of Mclean and Burleigh Counties. I introduced 1257 at the request of a constituent. This past fall he called the game and fish to find out how to transfer his gratis eligibility to his brother and was told it was against the law. When he told me this I myself was quite surprised since transferring of land for gratis does happen in the real world.

The bill as introduced will remove language limiting it to a spouse or legal dependent residing with the landowner to an immediate family member.

I felt this was a subject that deserved legislative debate. My feelings as I put this issue forward was that a immediate family would be parents, siblings and children. I feel that gratis lisenec recipients should only be residents of North Dakota. Attached is a e-mail of issues from a revue at the AG's office. I put this in for your consideration.

Mr chairman this issue is here for your consideration and I am sure this committee will do a good job of looking into the issue.
