February 18 (Tues.)	31st	Bills and resolutions except constitutional amendments and study resolutions must be reported out of committee in house of origin. Deadline for introducing amendments to the Constitution of North Dakota and study resolutions.

March 3 (Mon.)	37th	Study resolutions and proposed constitutional amendments must be reported out of committee

² Article IV, Section 7, Constitution of North Dakota. North Dakota Century Code Sections 54-03-02 and 54-03.1-02. On June 25, 2002, the Legislative Council selected Monday, December 2, 2002, as the date of convening of the organizational session.

³ In 1999, 2001, and 2003 the House and Senate were in session on Martin Luther King Day and George Washington's Birthday, and in 1999 and 2001 both houses were in session on Good Friday.

⁴ The House and Senate made crossover on the 33rd legislative day, Thursday, February 20.

⁵ Article IV, Section 7, of the Constitution of North Dakota, limits regular sessions to 80 natural days during a biennium and defines a "natural day" as a period of 24 consecutive hours. House and Senate Rules 104 provide that a legislative day begins at 7:00 a.m., so each legislative day ends at 7:00 a.m. the following day.
