Rep. Delamr: Chair of Judiciary B committee. Gave an overview of HB 1048, 1049, and 1050.

Tim Dawson: Legislative Council. Gave a Further overview of HB 1048, 1049, and 1050.

Kyle Blanchfield: North Dakota Professional Guides and Outfitters. (see attached testimony).

Roger Rosvitt: North Dakota Game and Fish Department. Testified in Support of 1048.

However, had concerns concerning frequency of testing.

Chair Nelson: You prefer that only one test be given and no retesting afterwards.

Roger Rosvitt: After 5 years maybe enough time. Annual testing is overkill.

Rep. Kelser: This bill has a minor fiscal note why are we not charging a fee for taking this test.

Roger Rosvitt: The costs have increased for licensing from \$100 to \$200. I would assume those costs have been built in to that fee.

Rep. Kelsh: Continuing education.

Roger Rosvitt: That could be rolled into the testing.

Kyle Blanchfield: Most states have no liscensing required. We would love to team up with game and fish to further education.

Rep. Hunsakor: Testing does not indicate knowledge. Continuing education would better guarantee knowledge.

Kyle Blanchfield: I agree with you 100%.
