SENATOR JUDY LEE opened the public hearing on HB 1078 relating to the confidentiality of personal information obtained by a state agency in administering occupational or professional licenses.

ANITA DECKER, Director of the School Approval and Accreditation Division of the Department of Public Instruction, testified in support of HB 1078.

(Written testimony) (Meter # 3691 - 3842)

SENATOR LEE: Questioned as to what would be circumstances that someone would request information.

ANITA DECKER: Example given of a disgruntled teacher ... who questioned the authenticity of the license and the credentialing of the person who did get the position. Hard pressed not to provide the information she was seeking. ... Under this bill, we would have the option of providing information or deleting information, depending on who is requesting it.
