Minutes:CHAIRMAN FREBORG called the committee to order. Roll Call was taken with all (6) members present.

CHAIRMAN FREBORG opened the hearing on HB 1125 relating to the state scholars program.

Testimony in support of HB 1125:

PEGGY WIPF, Director of Financial Aid within the ND University System Office, testified in support of the bill. (see attached)

SENATOR LEE asked if this bill can be reconciled to SB 2200. MS. WIPF stated that SB 2200 changes the selection criteria and this bill would fall into the selection criteria of SB 2200. By striking the last sentence in this bill, they would be able to award in early October.

SENATOR CHRISTENSON asked if there was any other criteria other than test scores used in awarding the scholarships.

MS. WIPF stated No, not for this program, only the ACT test and the class rank.
