Chairman Flakoll noted that Dr. Grondahl was ready to testify this morning at the scheduled time but the hearing on HB 1396 ran long. She is unable to attend this afternoon but has submitted written testimony and has sent someone in her place.

Jordan Woodbury, Senior Meat Inspector for the North Dakota Meat Inspection Program, testified in favor of the bill (written testimony by Dr. Andrea Grondahl, State Meat Inspection Director, North Dakota Department of Agriculture)

Senator Klein asked even though the inspection requirement hasn't been in the law, have you been doing it anyway?
