Rep. Price had concerns with 2 annual fees and does not want to go down the survey process for assisted living because it is a totally different type of establishment. That is the main reason we are staying with the Dept. of Human Services for the licensures to avoid all of that.

Shelly Peterson, ND Long Term Care Assoc. appeared to explain the \$75.00 fee which is simply paper compliance. Application must be completed with information on what your food and lodging is. The most intense will be the Dept. of Health where the Food and Lodging Division will come out and look at the issues with sanitation within the kitchen and life safety issues, to assure that it is a safe and sanitary facility.

Rep. Uglem wanted clarification of this basically clarifying the definition, gives the license to make it easier to collect from insurance companies. Also takes it out of the title of boarding house, makes its own section and defines assisted living and it allows for licensure.

Rep. Porter moved a DP, second by Rep. Potter. 13 - 0 - 0. Rep. Pollert to carry the bill.

This legislation replaces the old boardinghouse definition with a more current assisted living definition similar to the definition the Department of Human Services uses when registering these facilities. Our department is responsible for licensing and inspecting these facilities. In the current biennium, these facilities are licensed as boardinghouses and pay a license fee similar to restaurants based on seating capacity. This legislation creates a new license category for assisted living facilities and sets that fee at \$75 which will generate slightly more revenue than the current fees paid by facilities. All other changes to this bill are housekeeping in nature and simply replace the term "boardinghouse" with a more appropriate term – "assisted living facility".

The slight increase in revenue represents the increase that will be collected by establishing the fee at \$75 for each facility as opposed to the current fee structure based on capacity. These funds will be deposited into the general fund.
