Minutes:

CHAIRMAN COOK called the committee to order. All members (6) were in attendance.

CHAIRMAN COOK opened the hearing on HB 1178 relating to the contents of a notice of administrative rulemaking.

John Walstad, Legislative Council, appeared neither in support or opposed to HB 1178. This bill originated with a request from the Attorney Generals Office, pointing out a couple of problems we have with the administrative rule making notice contents. When an agency begins an administrative rule making proceeding it is necessary for the agency to prepare two kinds of notice; one is what is called a full notice, which requires a greater amount of information on what the rule making will involve, an explanation of what the rules will be, a statement of whether there is going to be an impact on the regulated community of fifty thousand dollars or more, a place where interested parties can see a copy of the rule and a place where interested parties can obtain a copy. Under existing law interested parties have thirty days after the public hearing on
