Minutes: Chairman Keiser opened the hearing on HB 1185.

Rep. Lawrence Klemin introduced the bill and elaborated on the intent of this proposed legislation. (See attached) This bill makes the privacy protection apply only to documents filed after 1/1/2002, which is the same effective date in the law passed last session. It removes unnecessary and conflicting language regarding termination statements. This bill is an exception to the general prohibition against disclosure.

Rep. Ekstrom: So fed tax ID and Social Security numbers will no longer be given out? How many records are affected by this?

Rep. Klemin: Yes, but "from this date forward" means January 1, 2002. I don't have the answer to your question about numbers.

Llona Sailing, Secretary of State's office: We support this bill. We have filings that go back to 1965, when we went into effect. And they stay active. As long as they are continued every five

Rep. Kasper: How difficult would it be to redact upon request, on a case by case basis?

Rep. Klemin: That's the problem, they get thousands of requests.

Shells Dahlen, Ward County Recorder: County Recorders are in support of this bill.

No one appeared to testify in opposition to HB 1185. Chairman Keiser closed the hearing.

Minutes: CHAIRMAN KEISER salled for committee work on HB 1185 that relates to financing statements and terminating statements under the Uniform Commercial Code (UCC).

REP. KASPER asked why this bill addresses documents created after 1/1/02, why records prior to that date are not covered under this legislation.

EDWARD ERICKSON (ATTY GENERAL'S OFFICE) explained that the technology isn't yet available to delve into old records and redact SS#s. Updated software eventually will be able to take care of such an onerous task.

REP. RUBY asked if there are any exemptions.

VOTE: 14-0-0.

ERICKSON explained that this legislation is intended to close a gap that will prevent ID theft but not deny creditors access to information they require.

REP. EKSTROM moved a Do Pass. REP. SEVERSON seconded. The motion carried.
