**Chair Nelson** called the meeting on HB 1224 relating to the use of boats to retrieve waterfowl to order.

**Rep. Porter** introduced HB 1224 and proposed a hog house amendment. (See Attached)

**Roger Rosvitt:** Testified on Behalf of HB 1224. I had not intended to testify on behalf of HB 1224. The intent of this bill is to increase the amount of harvest by hunting in edge areas of rest areas.

**Tim Kolke:** Testified neutral on HB 1224. Opposed to the original form of the bill since populations are high and there is no reason to cut off opportunity for hunting with his son.

**Dan Halstad:** Testified in neutral to HB 1224. Opposed to original form of the bill. Motor boats are a very traditional way to hunt waterfowl. Field hunting is already limited please leave the water opportunity open.

**Chair Porter** closes the hearing.

**Chair Nelson** reopens HB 1224 in committee work.

**Rep. Porter** moves a hog house amendment. **Rep. Clark** Seconded the motion.

**Rep. Porter:** Explains the details as to how this would fit in to the overall access programs.

**Rep. Johnson:** I do not see the need for this bill. These refuges already exist. We have record number of waterfowl.

**Chair Nelson:** Nonresidents are duck hunter and residents are goose hunters. Boats can permanently scare of geese. This is here for the goose hunters. I think this is good policy.

**Rep. Nottestad:** This will create more rest areas. There will be more damage to farms. This is not a good farmer bill.

**Chair Nelson:** Referred the committee to a map representing locations of waterfowl rest areas.

Motion passed by voice vote.

**Rep. Porter** Motioned a do pass as amended on HB 1224. **Rep. Nottestad** seconded the motion.

Motion carries by a vote of 10-2-2. **Rep. Clark** will carry.



**Senator Thomas Fischer**, Chairman of Senate Natural Resources Committee opened the hearing on HB 1224 relating to waterfowl resting areas.

All members of the Committee were present.

**Representative Todd Porter** of District 34 cosponsor of HB 1224 stated a new program within the PLI (Private Lands Initiative) would be the best way to manage to the increased pressure on larger bodies of water for waterfowl not allowing them to rest or roost during the day because excess speed of motorized crafts. Technically, this could be done administratively through the PLI program but the message needs to be sent to North Dakota Game & Fish Department and the sports person that access is a top priority of the legislature and this will help alleviate some of the pressure. A new program would be started within the PLI program that would allow the Game & Fish to go out and secure private land leases around the body of water and then state

As well, there is a safety concern for those using boats on large or fast moving bodies of water.

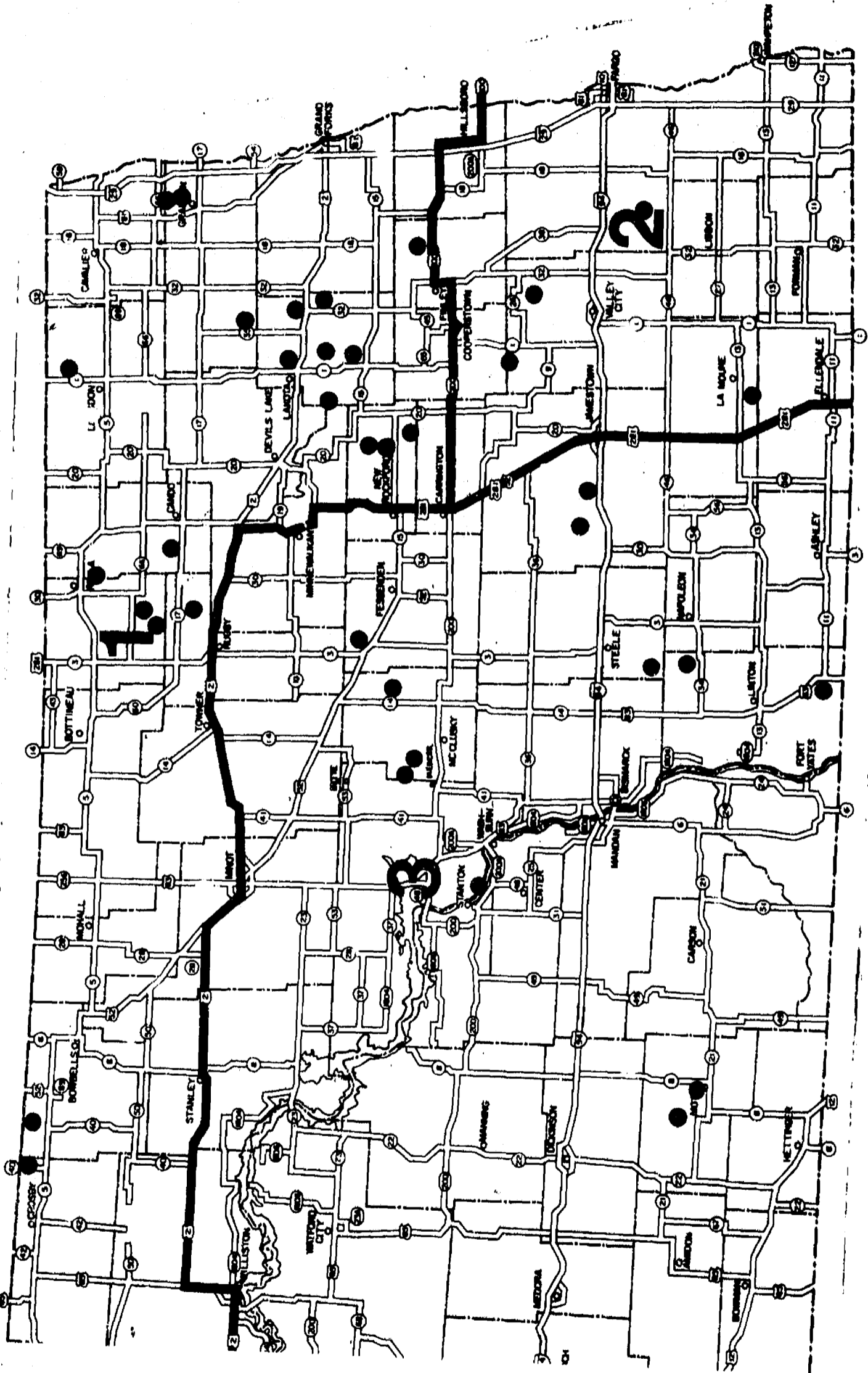
We really cannot offer a good solution to the problem at this time; too many "what ifs."
