All members of the Committee were present.

Representative Todd Porter of District 34 cosponsor of HB 1224 stated a new program within the PLI (Private Lands Initiative) would be the best way to manage to the increased pressure on larger bodies of water for waterfowl not allowing them to rest or roost during the day because excess speed of motorized crafts. Technically, this could be done administratively through the PLI program but the message needs to be sent to North Dakota Game & Fish Department and the sports person that access is a top priority of the legislature and this will help alleviate some of the pressure. A new program would be started within the PLI program that would allow the Game & Fish to go out and secure private land leases around the body of water and then state
